

# Russia Declared Taking Time for Cold War Truce

LONDON (UPI) — The Soviet Union has decided to take its time in maneuvering toward a cold war truce with the United States, high Communist diplomats indicated today.

Soviet Premier Nikita Khrushchev apparently is in no immediate hurry for quick new East-West arrangements because of his deepening conflict with Red China and his preoccupation with internal problems, such as farm lags and ideological unrest among Russia's intellectuals.

The diplomats indicated strongly that Khrushchev has no plans at present to offer new proposals to the West beyond those presented in the recent partial nuclear test ban treaty.

No Diplomatic Initiative

For this reason, Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko will not take any new diplomatic initiative when he confers later this month with President Kennedy and Secretary of State Dean Rusk, the diplomats said. Gromyko is going to the United States to attend the United Nations General Assembly opening next Tuesday.

The diplomats said the Kremlin at present is not interested in "secondaries"—meaning issues that require time and are not urgent—such as the dissolution of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization and the scrapping of Allied bases, which Moscow previously had demanded on every possible occasion.

What is envisaged by the Russians, the diplomats said, is a sort of East-West "detente" as exemplified by the Moscow treaty which banned nuclear tests in the atmosphere, in outer space and under water.

Possible Developments

However, Soviet officials will seek continued relaxation by unhurriedly pursuing three possible developments in East-West relations, the diplomats said. They are:

—Measures against surprise attack, including notably the stationing of observers in strategic key points on either side of the Iron Curtain.

—An East-West non-aggression arrangement, preferably a non-aggression treaty between the Atlantic Alliance and the Communist Warsaw Pact.

—Agreement with the West on preventing the spread of nuclear weapons.

The Kremlin, the diplomats said, has no intention of stirring up a new Berlin crisis, although its position on Berlin and Germany is unchanged.

On Cuba, the diplomats said, Moscow will continue its present policy—no withdrawal of its "instructors" until the Cubans have been "adequately trained" and until the Cubans request the Kremlin to withdraw them. The Russians deny they have any combat troops in Cuba.

NEW AUTO UNVEILED

MODENA, Italy (UPI) — An experimental rear-engine sports car, the first in the history of the Alfa Romeo automobile company, made its inaugural appearance Wednesday. The new car, tested by Italian racing driver Luigi Bertocco, reached a speed of 60 miles an hour. Alfa Romeo officials said they had not yet decided whether to begin production of the model.

## Valuable Horses Die in Barn Fire

LEWISTON, Maine (UPI)—At least 15 valuable harness race horses were killed early today when a three-alarm fire swept five barns at the sprawling Lewiston Fairgrounds, officials said.

Police Capt. John Harkins said the number of horses killed could "reach 25 to 50."

Deputy Fire Chief Reginald Doucett said damage "could go as high as \$500,000, possibly higher." He said at least 15 horses were known to be dead. Cause of the blaze was not determined immediately.

The horses ranged in value from \$1,000 to about \$15,000.

## Kennedy Planning UN Policy Speech

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (UPI) — President Kennedy is expected to make his first visit to the United Nations since 1961 for a policy speech to the General Assembly this month, informed sources said today.

The General Assembly opens its 18th session next Tuesday.

Kennedy's appearance at UN headquarters would be a quick one, probably on Sept. 19, the sources said. Later in the assembly session, Secretary of State Dean Rusk is expected to be present, although the U.S. delegation will be headed by Ambassador Adlai E. Stevenson.
