

# Red China Not Likely To Try War in Foreseeable Future

LONDON (UPI)—Red China is not likely to try any armed aggression in the foreseeable future despite its increasing isolation, British experts on Communist affairs said today.

The experts said the Peking regime still is too weak militarily and economically to risk any major conflicts, particularly with the United States.

They pointed out the Peking's ideological and political quarrel with Moscow virtually ruled out Soviet help in the event of a war.

## Yurri Proposes Sales Tax Study

ONTARIO (UPI)—Ontario State Sen. Anthony Yurri (R-Ontario) says he will propose that Idaho and Oregon tax authorities and legislators meet to prepare sales tax legislation for introduction in 1965.

Yurri said he favored simultaneous introduction of such legislation at the next regular sessions of the legislatures. He said both states have high rate income taxes and that the subordinate units of government are "fighting like vultures" over property tax levies.

## Contract Awarded For Forest Road

KLAMATH FALLS — The award of a contract for construction of the Spencer Creek road has been announced by Forest Supervisor Alex Smith of Winema National Forest.

Stanley Wilt of Corvallis was awarded the contract on a bid of \$262,728.67. The construction project calls for extension of the Spencer Creek road from the end of construction currently under way by Klamath county to a point on the Dead Indian highway south of Lake of the Woods. A total of 10.7 miles are involved in the current contract.

Completion of the road will make a portion of the forest accessible which has previously been served only by low standard rough roads. Initially, the route will serve primarily log haul, but eventually the route will undoubtedly become an important recreation loop, Smith said.

nuclear war as a means of overcoming capitalism. But an authoritative British assessment of latest developments in the Sino-Soviet dispute indicated Red China is moving rapidly toward political, economic and military isolation.

The signs gathered by Western observers on the spot are that the Peking regime is aware it cannot reckon on Russian assistance if it gets itself involved in war.

Peking's current battle cries were said by the experts to be prompted by its present weakness rather than strength.

There has been growing speculation Russia might renounce the 30-year treaty of friendship and assistance concluded with Red China at the height of their friendship in the 1950s.

Red China was believed to have been warned recently by the Soviet it might find itself involved in armed conflict with the United States and Britain if it starts an offensive against India.

## Birth Control Topic At Welfare Meeting

SALEM (UPI)—The question of whether Oregon Welfare Department caseworkers should suggest birth control to welfare recipients could be a major issue at the Sept. 27 meeting of the State Public Welfare Commission.

A Planned Parenthood League birth control clinic is to be established in Portland Oct. 1. Welfare officials have advised Gov. Mark Hatfield that possible relations with the clinic will be discussed at the meeting.

A policy decision on whether caseworkers should refer welfare recipients to the privately-operated clinic may be made.

Killed were Sgt. David S. Sheehan, 21, of Jamaica Plain, Mass., and Pfc Danny R. Boswell, 22, of Houston, Tex. Frank Menefee, 25, of Newport, Ky., was in serious condition and Michael B. Layman, 19, of Albany, Ore., was in fair condition.

## Hope Dwindles For Missing Girls

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn. (UPI)—Police and the Federal Bureau of Investigation today neared the end of the line in the search for two little girls who haven't been seen since last Saturday.

Capt. Henry Deason, head of the police homicide squad, said that so far there had not been a solid lead to go on.

The final "blanket search" in South Minneapolis was to be completed today by a force of 20 policemen and 20 FBI agents. The girls, Melissa Anna Lee, 5, and Barbara Foshag, 4, were last seen playing in an alley behind their homes. Police fear they were taken by a man who had been seen offering candy to children in the neighborhood.

A playmate told police the stranger forced Melissa into his car after she refused some candy. The playmate said Barbara then got in of her own accord. Hawkinson said police were checking every tip and clue but he dismissed a ransom note asking for \$2 million as "hogwash" and the work of a crank.
