

Dodgers Beat Phils, Hold Slim Lead as Redbirds Win

Southpaw Pete Richert pitched his first complete game in a year Saturday and enabled the Los Angeles Dodgers to defeat the Philadelphia Phillies, 5-1.

Richert received offensive help from Ken McMullen and Tommy Davis who slammed home runs to keep the Dodgers 2½ games ahead of the St. Louis Cardinals who beat the Milwaukee Braves, 3-2.

Richert, winning his fifth game against one defeat, blanked the Phils until the eighth when Bobby Wine hit his fifth homer. He allowed four other hits and fanned seven, one less than Philadelphia's John Bozzer who worked seven innings.

The only other Phillies' threat came in the sixth when Cookie Rojas tripled with one out. Richert then retired Johnny Callison and Tony Taylor on fly balls to ease out of the jam.

Bob Gibson needed relief help in the ninth inning when the Braves rallied for a run but rookie Ron Taylor came on to retire the next three batters.

Bill White's 26th homer in the sixth inning was the margin of victory for St. Louis.

The San Francisco Giants backed Jack Sanford's 15th pitching triumph with a 14-hit attack for a 7-3 decision over the Pittsburgh Pirates.

The loss was the 12th for the Pirates in their last 14 games.

Sanford, who has lost 13, needed ninth inning help from Billy Pierce.

The Cincinnati Reds, led by

Vada Pinson and backed by Joey Jay's three-hit relief pitching, defeated the Chicago Cubs, 8-4.

Pinson drove in four runs with a three-run homer and a single. Jay came on in the third inning in relief of starter Dom Zanni to pick up his seventh win of the year. He has 17 losses.

Rogue River Victor Over Glendale

ROGUE RIVER — Rogue River high's Chieftains launched their football slate here Friday night by tomahawking Glendale 33 to 13 and uncovering some reserve strength they didn't realize they had.

The Chieftains touched down in every quarter while Glendale did not reach pay soil until the last.

Alan Gates tallied three times for Rogue River on end sweeps, going 25 yards in the second quarter, 17 yards in the third and nine in the fourth. Jim Le Roy passed to Gus Schefstrom in the first quarter for six yards and a score and hurled to Dan Bellamy for 13 yards and a fourth quarter counter. Only conversion was in the third period on a LeRoy sneak.

Two points went to the Chiefs on a safety in the second canto when Glendale Hubert Stewart was tackled in the end zone.

The Pirates' first TD was on an H. B. Clark to Emery Foster pass for 30 yards and Bill Hubler carried for the bonus.

Wayne Troxell, an end, intercepted a Rogue River pass and ran 83 yards to the goal.

Good Blocking
Key to triumph, RR Coach Wayne Misener said was "real good downfield blocking, on the sweeps, especially." He noted good play in general from his charges and said they "worked together as a team."

Fullback Larry Craig was outstanding in the blocking. RR passing was sharp with Schefstrom and Bellamy on the receiving end. The Chiefs completed 12 of 21 throws for 112 yards. Schefstrom also stood out as a blocker.

Performances of tackle Dave Strickland, end Bill Keohen, guard Dave Guest and center Glen Ernest showed Misener that the Chiefs have more depth than he figured.

With 300 yards netted from rushing, Rogue River ran up a total of 412 scrimmage yards. Glendale had 82 yards on the ground and 43 via air for 125 net. Rogue River ran up 13 first downs to five by the Pirates crew. The Buccaneers completed just three of 14 passing tries.

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SPORTS Phoenix Pirates Whip Serra 21-0

SALEM—Phoenix high's well-manned football aggregation, with good blocking in the line, overpowered Serra Catholic's Sabre's here Friday night in the season launcher for both schools.

The Pirates from Southern Oregon struck for single touchdowns in the first, second and third quarters in a game more lopsided than indicated by the final score.

Phoenix moved 56 yards in 12 plays for its first touchdown with Ron Williams scampering 22 yards on an option. In the second period came a nine-play, 60-yard effort with Dennis Grennan punching over from the one.

For the third quarter Jim Consbruck took a Sabre punt on his own 40-yard line, raced to the right and journeyed to the goal behind a picket line.

Granby Converts
Jon Granby ran all three conversions.

Two sophomores figure to break into the first purple team in the two-platoon system which Owens plans to keep using. They are left-halfback Ron Medved of Tacoma and left end Joe Mancuso, a good pass grabber from the same nearby city.

The bright spot in the line where Owens tabs his veteran guards as "excellent" and his tackles "good."

Rick Redmond and Rick Sortun, both guards, are high on Owens' list. He feels that Redmond is a little stronger than Chuck Allen—the Huskies great guard of recent memory—and can become as good a linebacker.

"I wouldn't trade those guards for any others in the country," Owens said.

Mike Briggs and Joe Ryan give Owens experience at tackle. While John Stupey, a converted guard, holds down center. Back of him is another former guard, Fred Forsberg, which underlines Owens' statement, "graduation wiped out our ends, halfbacks and centers."

Owens thinks that he might wind up using three quarterbacks, with a sophomore named Al Libke moving in to spell Siler and Douglas.

Once more, Owens will use his first and second teams for about equal periods during a quarter.

"The new substitution rules fit into our playing pattern," he said. "Coaches that like to have all-offense or all-defense units will have more problems. I like two-way players."

Owens, who doubles as the school's athletic director, is looking for his team to mature.

"We could get better as the season progresses if our kids grow up," he said.
