

Radio Operator for Birmingham Police Kept Busy by Strife

The noise from the South Side demonstrations is beginning to be heard and felt, even across the mountain...

A stranger in town might think that the entire city of Birmingham was a jungle, unsafe for human habitation.

Oddly enough, there are thousands of persons - Negro and white - living in the coal and iron city who never come in contact with the racial strife...

This attitude persists although there are some areas of Birmingham that are highly unsafe after dark.

The main trouble zone of the city starts at about 16th st. on the south end of town and spreads south and west for many blocks.

Negroes also live in practically all the other sections of Birmingham proper but in pockets rather than large concentrations.

Armstrong complained his youngsters formerly had to go 2 1/2 blocks to a Negro school, whereas Graymont is only two blocks away from their home.

Another of the desegregated schools, West End, is in the midst of a mixed neighborhood. Not far to the southwest lies Bossemer, the location of a big U.S. Steel Co. mill.

Closer to downtown Birmingham are the homes of many middle and upper economic class Negroes. It is in this area that Arthur Shores, a Negro attorney active in the desegregation struggle, lives.

Pendleton Cowboy Wins All-Around Title at Roundup

PENDLETON (UPI) - Mac Griffith of Pendleton jolted his way to the all-around cowboy title at the Pendleton Roundup Saturday.

Griffith, a stock rancher and farmer, took the award on the strength of a first place finish in the bulldogging event and a second in Brahma bull riding.

His combined total for three go-rounds in bulldogging was 29.4 seconds. He earned \$1,838 topping another Pendleton cowboy, Les Kamm, who collected \$1,774.

In other events, Dale Smith, Chandler, Ariz., took first in the calf roping with a combined three animal total of 49.1 seconds.

Behind Griffith in the bulldogging competition was John W. Jones, San Luis Obispo, Calif., with a total time of 30.2 seconds for three go-rounds.
