

Major Differences Noted in British, U.S. Links Rules

NEW YORK (UPI)—The U. S. and British golf rulemakers found themselves fairways apart today for the first time in 10 years after virtually dissolving their "uniform rule."

Four major rules were changed without agreement from both sides.

The U.S. Golf association and the Royal and Ancient club of St. Andrews, Scotland, which distates British golf rules, Tuesday announced wholesale changes in 21 of the 41 "uniform rules" which have been in effect since 1952.

The major differences were these:

1. On a ball striking an unattended flagstick—In the U. S. there will be a penalty of loss of hole in match play or two strokes in medal for hitting the pin from the putting green or from within 20 yards of the hole. The British stay with one penalty.

2. Unplayable ball—The U. S. reduces the penalty for dropping a ball from an unplayable lie from two strokes to one stroke and also rules that a ball may be dropped within two club

Medford, Central Top Grid Poll

PORTLAND (UPI)—Defending champion Medford ranked in first place in the Journal coaches' poll today among class A-1 high school football teams. Medford had 78 of a possible 80 points.

North Salem was second. Grants Pass third, Jefferson of Portland fourth and Roseburg and Pendleton tied for fifth. They were followed, in order, by Beaverton, Grant, Cottage Grove and Tigard.

Also getting votes were Parkrose, Clackamas, South Eugene, Central Catholic, Sunset and West Linn.

Central headed the A-2 poll, followed, in order, by Seaside, Phoenix, Vale, North Catholic, Gold Beach, Philomath, Yamhill-Carlton, Bandon and Stiuslaw.

Boise High Hopes To Give 'Representative' Battle

"We hope to give Medford a representative game," So declared Ed Knecht, Boise high school head football coach this morning.

Medford's Black Tornado plays in the Idaho town this Friday night.

The Boise aggregation has played two games to Medford's one so far this season, winning Meridian, Idaho, 39 to 0 and Rancho de Las Vegas, Nev., 52 to 14.

Asked how his team is shaping up, Knecht replied, "It's rather hard to tell. We haven't had a good test. We've been progressing but we're not ready for a team of Medford's caliber."

Rebuilding Boise in the past has had a big name in Idaho football. It is Knecht's task to bring it out of recent doldrums. This year he has a nucleus of 14 lettermen, nine of whom are on the starting offensive unit and three of whom are on the defensive platoon.

Frank Bosch, tackle, at 265, the largest player on the Boise crew, and Vern Morse, right halfback were offensive regulars last year. Regulars back on the defensive game are Kent Scott and Steve Brown, cornermen and Jim Hilbel, end.

Knecht describes his team as small. His charges use the T formation and variations, spreading an end occasionally and slotting a back.

Boise and Medford High schools are of comparable size with respective enrollments of 2,100 and 2,000 students.

Mentor Bob Radcliff of the McLoughlin Bulldog aggregation, stated he was pleased with the turnout of approximately 44 athletes. Radcliff said their offense was coming along fairly slow, but the defense was shaping up nicely. Radcliff went on to say that the Bulldogs have a fairly large line and the backs are very quick.
