

Liver Transplant Patient Said Fair

BOSTON (UPI) — A team of surgeons has transplanted a human liver from a cadaver to a patient suffering from serious liver disease. It has been announced by Peter Bent Brigham Hospital.

Dr. F. Lloyd Mussels, hospital director, said the patient's condition is fair. He emphasized, however, that it is much too soon to evaluate the success of the operation.

This is the first time Brigham surgeons have attempted a human liver transplant. However, Mussels said such transplants had been performed elsewhere, including one at Denver, Colo., though he did not know the outcome of any of these cases.
