The bride-elect attended Southern Oregon college her freshman year. The wedding is planned for August, 1964.



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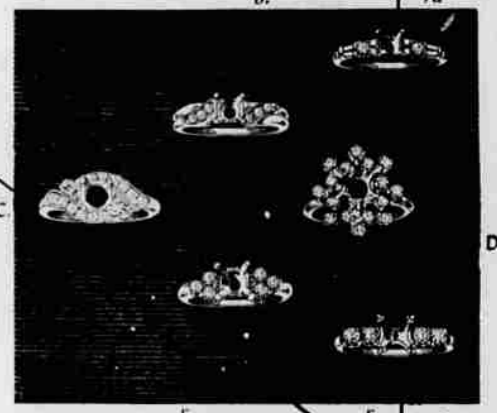
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
