

### Deputies Arrest Two After Robbery

PORTLAND (UPI) — Multnomah County sheriff's deputies shot and wounded one man and arrested another after a market southeast of Portland was robbed Friday night.

The gunfire erupted after the two men held up the L & F Drive in Market and escaped with \$135.

Deputies Bud Benton and Bill Cutter pursued the getaway car and stopped it. They said Doyle Edward Sullivan, 42, Portland, jumped out and fired a shotgun blast at Cutter.

The deputy dropped to the ground to escape injury. Benton fired six shots into the car and at Sullivan, who was fleeing on foot. One of the bullets struck Sullivan in the right shoulder.

The driver of the car, Murland F. Higley, 24, Rexburg, Idaho, was not hit. He was lodged in the county jail.

### AF Plane Crashes Near Vancouver

VANCOUVER, Wash. (UPI) — An Air Force F-102 jet fighter crashed east of here Saturday while attempting to land at Portland Air Force Base. The pilot was reported killed.

Witnesses said the plane missed a residential area east of the city and crashed into a grove of trees. It burst into flames after the body of the pilot was removed, according to Vancouver city police.

Name of the pilot was not released immediately.

An Air Force spokesman said the pilot had reported some mechanical difficulty in the plane and was attempting to bring it in for a landing. It was attached to the 460th Fighter Squadron at the base.

The crash occurred at 10:22 a.m.

### Legislators Offer To Cut Own Salaries

PORTLAND (UPI) — Three Oregon legislators said Friday the first act of any special session of the legislature should be to reduce legislators' salaries if voters turn down the \$60 million revenue increase Oct. 15.

State Sens. Anthony Yturri (R-Ontario) and Harry Boivin (D-Klamath Falls) issued a joint statement here. State Rep. Robert Dickinson (R-Lake Oswego) concurred in a newspaper column he writes.

Boivin and Yturri said reduction should be at least \$100 a month, "thereby setting a pattern for other reductions in the cost of the state's government."

Legislators now receive \$250 a month plus \$20 a day for expenses during the first 120 days of the session.

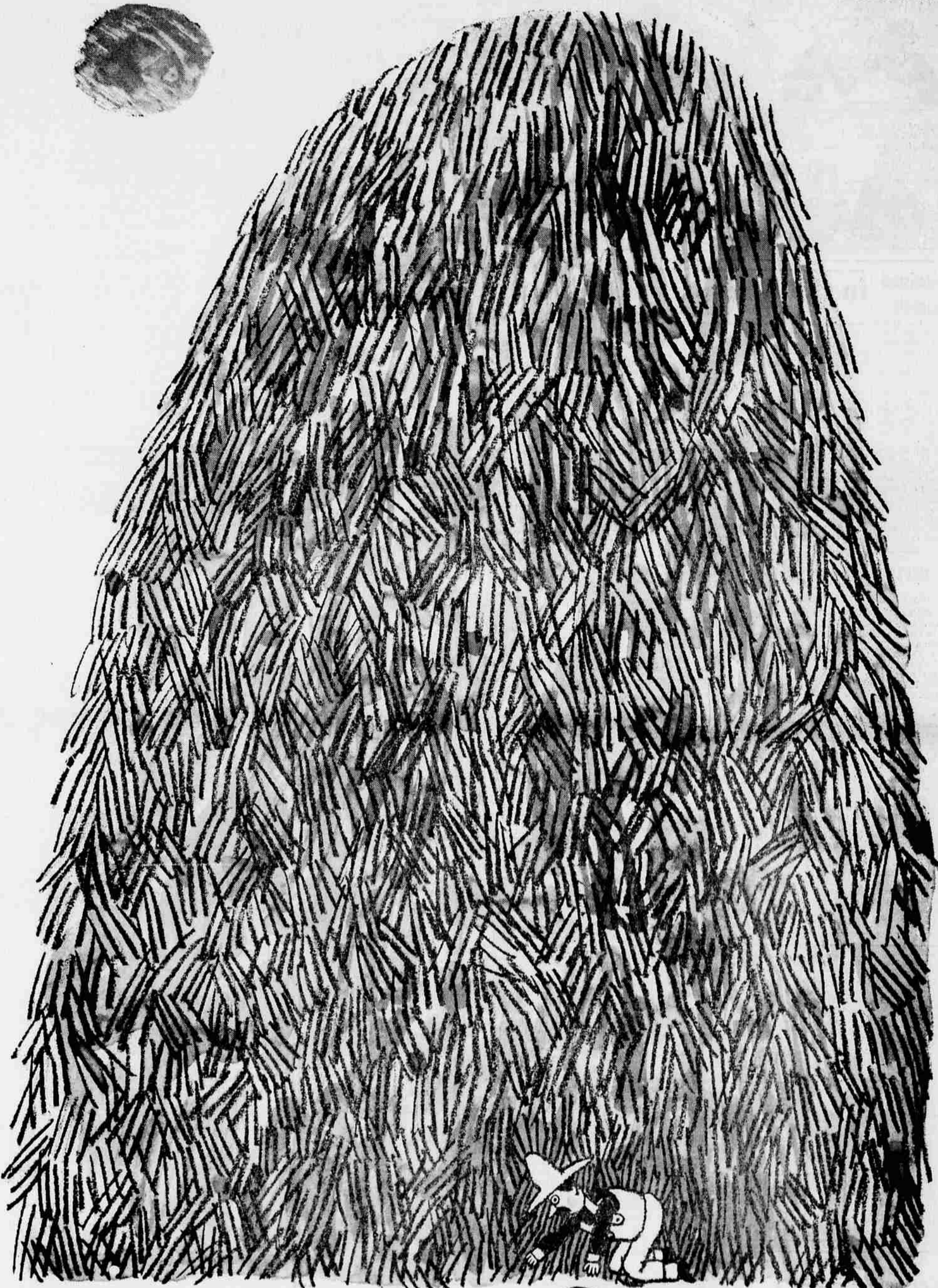
