

# Number of Accidents Are Investigated by Police

## \$17 Million Auto Race Track Planned

NEW YORK (UPI)—Not content with having outstripped California in population, California now is planning to outdo Indianapolis—the famous Speedway, that is.

According to Car and Driver magazine, a \$17 million auto race track will be built conveniently close to Los Angeles and its 13 million auto-oriented residents. Scheduled to be completed in 1965, California's answer to Indianapolis will sprawl over a 731-acre site, will accommodate 250,000 spectators and have parking space for 60,000 cars.

## Crossing Accident Causes Are Listed

CHICAGO (UPI)—More than 1,100 persons were killed and another 10,000 injured last year at railroad grade crossings, according to the Chicago Motor club.

Matthew C. Sielaki, director of the club's safety and traffic engineering department, said most grade crossings provide warning lights, bells, wig-wag signals or portable gates. He said a majority of grade crossing accidents are the result of inattention or excessive speed.
