

Cloth Hat Becomes Entrenched Among Wardrobe Items

With the upcoming fall season, it appears that the cloth hat has, indeed, come "of age"—no longer a "novelty" but a solidly entrenched part of a man's headwear wardrobe.

New fabrics and patterns are bowing in. The hats are being finely styled, and many are made to fully withstand the weather and to take crushing without damage.

The cloth hat shapes for fall are similar to those for fells. First in favor is the center-dent, followed closely by the center crease. Brims take 1 1/2 inch as their pivotal point—narrower for the younger men—wider for the older and more conservative. Included will be new versions of the telescope for men who favor this shape.
