### View of Fashion Inspires Jewelry Designers in '63

Fall's view of fashion has inspired jewelry designers to create styles especially to accent new topside shapes such as high-rising waistslines accompanied by extra little jackets, cutaway bodices and portrait necklines.

Puffed and billowy sleeves focus attention on bracelets and single charms. Pendants and beads fill in necklines beautifully.

Jacket necklines determine the type of jewelry to be worn. Vertical and V shape necklines lengthen the appearance of a short neck. They can be accented by a maltese-length necklace or a diamond drop pendant; both, move the eye downward for a slender look.

Curved Prongs

Many pins with curved prongs allow space in back so that they can be attached to necklaces and worn as a pendant.

High collars add softness to a too-slender neck and are perfect foils for showing off a pin at the collar edge or shoulder seam.

For bared necklines, a favorite choker of pearls acquires an elegant touch when an ordinary metal clasp is replaced by a mound of pearls nestled with diamonds.

### Rural Housing Loan Program Expanded To Include Others

GRANTS PASS — The rural housing loan program of the Farmers Home administration has been expanded and a recent modification may enable additional families to qualify, Eugene M. Denney, supervisor of Jackson and Josephine counties, has announced.

"Families living in rural areas and small rural communities, even though not engaged in farming, may now be eligible," Denney said. This is in addition to families who are engaged in farming. He emphasized, however, that loans may not be made in subdivision areas.

The rural housing loans are authorized for construction, reconstruction, repair and remodeling of dwellings and essential farm buildings and include domestic water supply. Size and type of construction of dwellings must be adequate to meet the needs of the family, but is limited to what is modest in size and design.

To qualify, a family must own a farm or housing site in a rural area or small community, Denney said. They must show that sufficient income will be available to meet all expenses and debt payments. Refinancing is not authorized, but the loans may at times be made on a second mortgage basis.

Favorable Interest Rate

The 4 per cent rate with repayment period up to 33 years is

favorable. The loans are not, however, made in competition with services of other established credit firms, he pointed out. If a family has income and financial resources to obtain other financing on terms they can reasonably be expected to repay, they may not qualify for the loans.

The program is important in promoting development of rural areas. It not only helps a family obtain better homes, but also may provide more jobs for builders and increased sales in construction materials, Denney noted.

A new authorization provides additional services for senior citizens. In addition to the other housing purposes, these loans may include purchase of home-site and in some instances, of a previously occupied dwelling. They apply to individuals 62 years of age and over, Denney noted.

Additional information on the loans may be obtained at the Farmers Home administration office in Grants Pass, which services the Jackson and Josephine county areas. The office is located in the Southern Oregon Bank building and the mailing address is post office box 311, Grants Pass, Ore.

Both elegant and sportive interpretations appear in fur seal, Persian lamb, American broad-

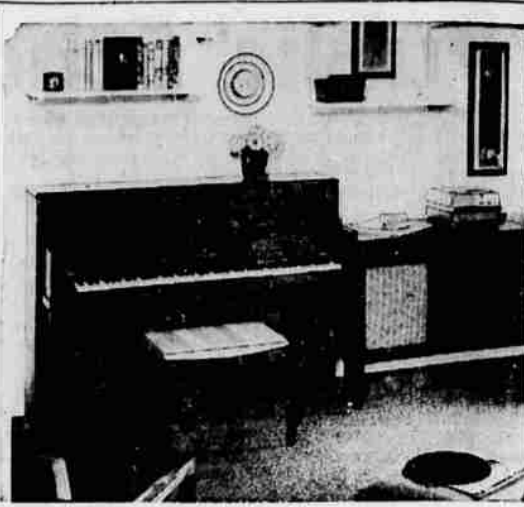
tail, opossum, beaver, otter, sheared raccoon — to name just a few of fall's leaders.

In addition, Crabtree promised a cleanup of any organized commercial gambling in the county.



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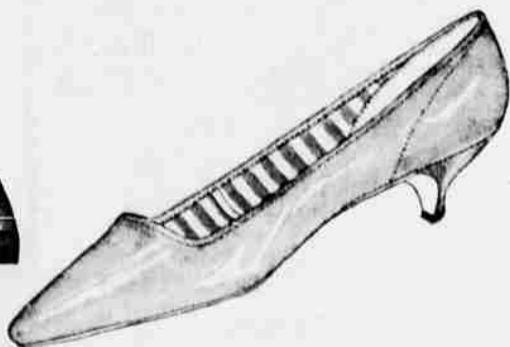
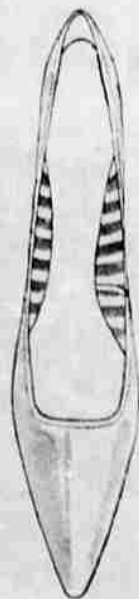
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
