



### Profumo Scandal Report Absolves Prime Minister

LONDON (UPI)—Britain's official investigator of the Profumo scandal today cleared Prime Minister Harold Macmillan's government of any breach of security in the affair.

The long-awaited report by Lord Denning, Britain's second ranking jurist, also cleared other cabinet ministers of any involvement in the scandal that linked War Minister John Profumo with redhaired call girl Christine Keeler. But at the same time Lord Denning said Macmillan and his aides should have been aware of what was going on between the cabinet minister and the play girl.

**Dilemma Sketched**

The report, published a half hour after midnight, sketched the dilemma of a government headed by Macmillan, of Eton,

Oxford, and the Grenadier Guards, in dealing with Profumo, of Harrow, Oxford, and the Northhamptonshire Yeomanry.

Raising questions about Britain's hallowed tradition of doing things by "the old school tie," the report said:

"They (the government) could not conceive that any of their colleagues would have the effrontery to make a false statement to the House."

**Broadcast Scheduled**

Profumo had denied in the House of Commons that there was anything wrong in his relationship with Christine, but later he admitted his denial was a lie.

Macmillan scheduled a radio broadcast tonight to defend his position in the case.

Opposition Labor party leader Harold Wilson arranged a television appearance 45 minutes before Macmillan's address to press the Labor attack on the government.

**OUT OF ORDER**

EXETER, England (UPI) — Bookmaker Jack Dollar-Bear ruined out of order Wednesday when he asked for whisky instead of wine at a contest to find the fastest-serving barmaid at a local hotel. Contest organizer Jack Bradley said Dollar-Bear was asked to leave the room full of 250 guests because his whisky request was "unfair to the other barmaids who had more complicated orders."

## Dedication of New Production Reactor Slated at Hanford

HANFORD, Wash. (UPI) — President Kennedy today visits the Hanford Works Reservation, a 600-square-mile area which 20 years ago was a barren sagebrush desert inhabited only by a handful of dryland farmers and thousands of jackrabbits.

Before World War II the only visitors were rockhounds and an occasional Yakima Indian hunting wild horses that found refuge in the brakes that border the Columbia river where it carves a crooked course through the barren land.

## Kennedy Will See Surplus Station At Tongue Point

ASTORIA (UPI) — President Kennedy Friday will see an installation built in 1939 as a Navy air station which was converted into a reserve fleet base in 1946 and closed in 1960 as surplus.

Kennedy is scheduled to pay a 15-minute visit to the Tongue Point facility, which occupies 781 acres fronting the Columbia river just east of Astoria.

Tongue Point has 474 buildings and 9 piers with 19,000 lineal feet of berthing space. It includes a dredged basin fronting the pier area.

**Many Buildings**

The buildings include two huge hangars, brick and concrete barracks which have housed up to 1,000 men, administration and other service structures, and housing for nearly 400 families in permanently-built structures.

The station was built after years of pressure by local interests for a defense establishment at the mouth of the Columbia. It was finished just after the outbreak of World War II.

During the war, Tongue Point was an operating air station. When peace came it was not needed so in 1946 was converted into a base for reserve amphibious ships.

More than 200 vessels were berthed there for several years, and the eight piers were built to accommodate the reserve fleet.

Up to 1,000 uniformed men and 700 civilian workers manned the

**To Dedicate Reactor**

With the President today were an estimated 30,000 persons who came to watch him dedicate a new production reactor which not only will make weapons-grade plutonium for nuclear warfare but also will provide steam power to generate 860,000 kilowatts of electricity.

This will be the first dual-purpose reactor in the nation. The bill for this plant will run about \$195 million, and about \$25 million of that cost is associated specifically with features which make the reactor convertible to allow power generation.

The power plant itself will be operated by the Washington Public Power Supply System, an organization comprising 16 Washington public utility districts.

The first of the plant's two turbine generators is scheduled to come on the line in October, 1956. The second will be plugged in in December, 1965.

At present there are eight large scale production reactors in operation on the reservation. This is what the place has grown to since Hanford was appropriated by the federal government shortly after the start of World War II.

**Reverted to Ghost Town**

At that time the population of

the village of Hanford was 250. It zoomed to 15,000 when the plant was under construction but it reverted to a ghost town when building was completed.

Today, the persons who work at Hanford live in Richland, 25 miles to the south. Richland, itself, was about the size of Hanford before the Atomic Bomb,

but today it is a town of about 15,000. Combined with nearby Pasco and Kennewick to make the most populated places in the state outside of Seattle.

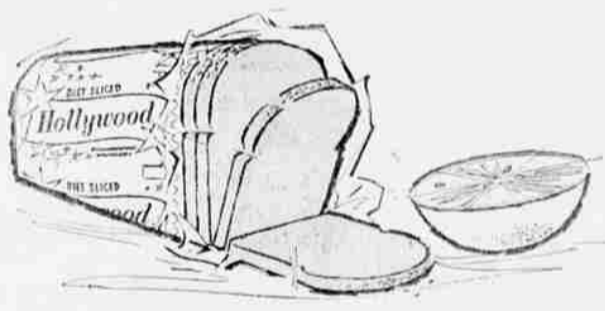
