WASHINGTON (UPI) — Administration officials meet with a joint session of the House Foreign Affairs committee and the House Agriculture committee today to discuss a possible wheat deal with Russia.

The closed-door session was called at the request of President Kennedy.

On hand for the discussion will be Agriculture Secretary Orville Freeman and Commerce Secretary Luther Hodges.

The meeting followed reports that American businessmen have been conferring in Canada with Russian delegates to discuss the sale of surplus wheat. Russia already has signed a half-billion dollar agreement with Canada for wheat.

In calling the joint session today, Rep. Harold D. Cooley (D-N.C.) said he was disappointed that more surplus products have not been sold to foreign nations.

Russia Ratifies Test Ban Treaty

MOSCOW (UPI)—The Presidium of the Supreme Soviet—this nation's highest legislative body—has unanimously ratified the partial nuclear test ban treaty.

The ratification, a formality under the Soviet system, came shortly after the U.S. Senate also voted overwhelmingly to ratify the treaty, which prohibits nuclear explosions in the atmosphere, outer space and underwater.

The Supreme Soviet's foreign affairs committee earlier recommended ratification and the Soviet press has praised the treaty constantly since the day it was signed.

The Supreme Soviet acts as the Soviet legislature. The Presidium handles the Supreme Soviet's business while the main body is in recess, as it is now.
