

# Crater's Comets Tussle Coquille

**CENTRAL POINT** — Crater High school's Comets wrap up their slate of pre-conference football competition here this evening — hoping to make it a perfect record.

Coquille of the Class A-2 ranks and Crater of Class A-1 meet at 8 p.m. in the Crater stadium at Central Point. The home team Fireballs enter the ruckus with a pair of

victories behind them. Coquille's Red Devils still are trying for their first win.

It will be the third straight year Crater Coach Keith Johnson has guided a club against his high school. The Comets won in both 1961 and 1962.

After tonight the Crater crew will get a chance to rest before going into its Southern Oregon conference slate. The Fireballs have a bye next week end. Then, they go up against Medford on Oct. 11.

This evening's encounter here will provide some comparison of the Class A-1 and A-2 teams of this area. Phoenix, of the Rogue league, rated No. 1 team among the A-2s of the state, blanked the Devils 28 to 0 last week.

Crater looks for the coast team to be tougher. Coquille reportedly has some capable personnel but has switched from single wing to split T offense. It's figured that the Devils will be more proficient this week and made it a point to avoid hard contact. They respect their foe tonight but appear to have their eyes also on the Medford battle.

With Medford in the Willamette valley, a sizeable delegation from the Pear city could be on hand to preview the Comets. This will be the only home game for Crater not conflicting with a home game of Medford.
