Steward cited the line defense of Dan Loper, Ayres, Morgan Miller, Dave Blair and Dan Colcleaser and pass defense of House and Colpitts. He said that Chamberlain, Bob Corliss and Vic Eccleston demonstrated improved performance with key stops.

On offense Miller was steady at center and guard Blair and backs Chamberlain and House did good blocking work. Blair was effective against Roger Vargo, Denver all-city lineman now with the Hornets.

Sooners Topple Trojans; Army Navy Blank Foes; Illini Win

The University of Oklahoma, once the scourge of the college gridiron, lifted itself right back into national prominence Saturday with a 17-12 upset victory over defending collegiate champion Southern California before a national television audience.

Controlling the ball for most of the game with a devastating ground attack, the Sooners made their first visit ever to Los Angeles a memorable one despite a field temperature of 109 degrees.

It was the first setback for Southern California since 1961. The Trojans won all 10 of their regularly scheduled games last year and then knocked off Wisconsin in the Rose Bowl.

Oklahoma packed all its scoring into the first half. The first touchdown resulted from a 66-yard drive engineered by sophomore quarterback Mike Ringer and was culminated by halfback Joe Dan Looney, who carried over from the 19.

The Sooners also scored on a four-yard field goal by Ringer and a 43-yard field goal by George Jarman.
