Three People Are Injured in Two Accidents in Area

Three persons were reported in good condition today following Wednesday automobile accidents, both involving log trucks.

At Sacred Heart hospital are Lowell O. Pogue, 42, of route 2, box 142, Eagle Point, operator of a pickup truck, and Leo Carl Graves, 61, of box 30, Tiller, who was driving the log truck.

At Crater Osteopathic hospital is Ellen Louise Childers, 46, of route 2, box 55E, Jacksonville.

According to Oregon state police, one accident occurred on Highway 62 near the entrance of the Veterans Administration Domiciliary, White City, at 2:40 p.m. Officers said the north-bound Pogue pickup, pulling a flat bed trailer, attempted to make a U turn on Highway 62, pulling in front of a log truck operated by Graves. Pogue fell out of the pickup in the impact, and Graves jumped from the logging truck before it turned over, officers said.

In the accident on Applegate rd. about 11:15 a.m., police said that Ellen Childers, who has the mail delivery route in the area, had stopped to deliver mail near a curve, when her pickup was struck by the south-bound log truck operated by William Henry Bohl, 31, of 3092 Jacksonville highway, Medford.

All three injured persons were taken to hospitals by Medford Ambulance service.

Jackie Greeted By Greek Press

ATHENS, Greece (UPI)—The Greek press greeted Mrs. Jacqueline Kennedy with warm enthusiasm today and the public respected her wish for a restful vacation in privacy.

There were some reports she might leave her rented seaside villa today to meet King Paul at the royal palace.

One Greek newspaper, reporting the arrival of the president's wife Wednesday for a two-week vacation, called her "more beautiful than on her first visit here two years ago."

All of Athens' morning newspapers carried front-page photos of Mrs. Kennedy smiling at Chrysanthemis Papacolis, the 12-year-old Greek girl who had a heart operation in the United States through the First Lady's intercession.

Two Greek women reporters praised Mrs. Kennedy's black suit and simple long, straight hairdo.

The President's wife went straight to the villa overlooking the Aegean Sea 15 miles from Athens. She spent the evening resting from the long jet flight from New York.

Fires Said Caused By Deer Hunters

PORTLAND (UPI)—Oregon deer hunters were responsible for a number of fires, but they had a good safety record with firearms on opening week end, State Game Director Phil Schneider said today.

Seven fires on state lands were definitely caused by hunters and another five were caused by smokers and campers, Schneider said. The largest blaze burned 60 acres.

Fourteen National Forest fires and four on Bureau of Land Management land also were reported in the state over the week end, but they were identified only as man-caused. There was no indication if hunters were responsible.

Schneider said the firearms record was the best since 1954. Four persons were wounded, one seriously. There were 12 accidents last year.

Walnut Husk Fly Found in Jackson

SALEM (UPI)—An infestation of the walnut husk fly has been found in the Medford area, the State Agriculture Department said today.

Hugh Taylor, chief of the department's plant division, said the infestation was the first known in Oregon.

The fly has been found throughout California and other nut growing areas in the United States.

Nuts with the worm were discovered by Jackson County Agent Donald W. Berry.

Specimens were sent to the State Agriculture Department and the California Department of Entomology.

Taylor said the fly does not enter the meat of the walnut, but affects the grade as it causes shell discoloration.

RESISTANCE
AKRON, Ohio (UPI)—Talk about stick-to-itiveness. Researchers at The Goodyear Tire and Rubber company report the tread rubber on an airplane tire must resist a centrifugal force equal to 2,000 times the pull of gravity when the tire is rolling at 200 miles an hour.
