Seven Killed as Shifting Steel Crashes on Auto

EAST LIVERPOOL, Ohio (UPI)—Seven persons were killed and one critically injured Wednesday night when 40,000 pounds of steel fell from a tractor trailer, crushing one car, and the truck then hit another auto near here.

The Highway Patrol said that three rolls of sheet stainless steel tumbled from the truck on a curve and one of them crushed a car operated by Judith Ann Lewis, 19, East Palestine, Ohio. She and her four passengers were killed.

The truck, thrown out of control by the sudden weight shift on an auto operated by William G. White Jr., 33, East Liverpool. His mother, Lelia, 58, was killed in the crash and his father, William G. White Sr., died several hours later at East Liverpool City hospital. The younger White was in critical condition today.

The victims in the Lewis car were identified as Nancy Knight, 12, Theresa Knight, 2, and Sally May, 17, all of East Palestine, and Louise Slagle, 15, Nagley, Ohio.

The driver of the truck, Vernon Hatcher, 27, Quaker City, Ohio, was not hurt.

Traffic on busy Ohio 7 was tied up for several hours by the crash.

Congressmen Vote Travel, Expenses Amid Boos, Cheers

WASHINGTON (UPI)—House members, alternately booning and cheering, authorized for themselves a new round of trips, investigations and official expenses Wednesday at a total cost of about \$1.2 million.

The boos were for Rep. H. R. Gross (R-Iowa), the well-known economist, who spoke against several of the items in the package of "housekeeping" bills. The cheers came when Gross requested for a roll call vote on one of the measures failed.

Among the items approved was an added \$500 salary allowance for each of the 435 members. This raised to a record \$2,400 a year the amount some other matters Extra allowances were provided for members' official telephone and telegraph bills and for stamps.

The added travel authority touched off one of the sharpest exchanges in recent House history as evidence Congress will still be in session at Christmas. They noted that the stationary store carries a nice line of handily seasonal items such as Christmas cards, leather goods and pen sets.

In another sign that fall has arrived, the Commerce and Agriculture committees were authorized to send delegations to scheduled international meetings on communications (Geneva), plane fares (Rome) and food and agriculture (also Rome).

Funds were voted for inquiries into research agriculture, interstate fares, banking and some other matters. Extra allowances were provided for members' official telephone and telegraph bills and for stamps.

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Kennedy's Offer Of Joint Moon Effort Criticized

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Rep. Katherine May (R-Wash.) suggested Wednesday the United States might be sacrificing a military advantage for a propaganda advantage if it joins the Soviet Union in an attempt to put men on the moon.

"To be first in propaganda but second in defense could be fatal," Mrs. May said in a news letter.

The Washington Republican questioned President Kennedy's proposal for a joint effort to reach the moon, saying the Russians could be expected to seek military control of space while "tying up" the United States in the joint expedition.
