EAGLE POINT — Playing Illinois Valley "will be a real challenge for these boys."

So remarked Vern Steward, head coach of the Eagle Point high football Eagles.

Eagle Point plays Illinois Valley this evening in a Rogue league game at Cave Junction.

"We know we are facing a pretty good team," said Steward. He mentioned the running and passing ability and the field generalship of IV's Darryl Gellert and the running of fullback Ron Thornhill and John Baumgardner along with the work at end of Terry McNaught.

The Eagles have been adding a few plays in attempt to cope with the Cougar size.

Doubtful Starters — Steward said that a few injuries had come to light from the Henley game last week and that the Eagle squad was not aware of until the first of the week. Knee injuries make doubtful starters of Vic Eccleston, guard and linebacker, and Bob Corliss, fullback and linebacker.

Illinois Valley holds victories over Rogue River (non-league) and St. Mary's (league) after starting with a non-counting loss to Gold Beach. Eagle Point has bowed to Brookings, Grants Pass junior varsity and Henley.

IV is one of the favorites in the Rogue chase.

Steward listed starters offensively as Ron Martinson and Dan Colcleaser or Dennis Murphy, ends; Dale Herrmann and Jerry Moore, tackles; Dave Blair and Merle Ford, guards; Morgan Miller, center; Bob Colpitts, quarterback; Mike House, left halfback; Dale Chamberlain, wingback, and Bob Corliss or Frank Charley or Colcleaser, fullback. Charley, a senior just turned out this week.

On defense it could be Herrmann, Dan Loper, Miller, Charley and Jerry Moore up front with Blair, Chamberlain and Jim Lay or Corliss, linebackers and Colpitts, House and Gary Young or Colcleaser, deep backs.

Medford, South Salem Grid Teams Clash Here Tonight

Class A-1 high school football returns to the Medford stadium this evening after three weeks absence.

Medford's Black Tornado has as guest the Saxons of South Salem high — the second successive Capital city rival for the Hurricane. Kickoff time is 8 p.m.

This will be strictly a battle of prestige. No league or district laurels are at stake. For each this will be the fourth and last warmup scuffle before entering counting conference competition — Medford in the Southern Oregon circuit and South Salem in the Valley league.

Medford is the rated favorite for this evening. The Black Tornado has been ranked No. 1 in the Associated Press prep poll this week and No. 2 in two others. South has gained mention of the pollsters but this week is not among the top 10 rated.

The clubs, so far, have met one common adversary. South bowed to North Salem 6 to 26 in its season opener and reportedly has come far in improvement since that time. Medford, rebounding and revitalized after a dismal night at Boise, Idaho, pasted North Salem's Vikings last week end 32 to 13.

Sixth Meeting — Comparison of those scores would favor the Tornado. But, time and experience have proved such measure is no sure way of reckoning. And, few would venture that the teams are as far apart as scores would seem to indicate.

This will be the sixth meeting of the two schools since they began gridiron rivalry in 1959. Medford has been victor in all five games so far contested. The 1962 count of 20 to 0 was the closest margin.

Against mentor Fred Spiegelberg's Black Tornado, Coach Marv Heater brings a wing T South team which has a well-balanced running and passing game. The Saxons possess good speed as a team.

South's line opens the way for backs Jim Nicholson, Mickey Wright, Rick Allen, Bill Bayne, Dick Vogt, Bob Putnam and Terry Noble. Putnam and Noble are the passers.

Medford will rely on the versatility of multiple T and single wing offense with Mike Barnes or Rich Knight steering the attack and passing and with Jim Cox, Bill Enyart, Greg Gandee, Tim Murray on the staff of ball carriers.

Will Platoon — Weights, at glance appear to balance out fairly even.

Coach Spiegelberg, anxious because an air of complacency on the Tornado squad, said that Medford would go with separate offensive and defensive platoons this week. Defensive end Bill Houston as of yesterday was still hobbling because of a knee injury in the North Salem game and Tim Murray may have starting call at the flank.

The coach said that reserve tackles Don Todd and Dave Durant would miss tonight's play. Todd hurt his ankle in the fray last Friday and Durant suffered a concussion in practice before the Boise game. He saw some action at Boise.

Two other Southern Oregon conference teams are hosts this evening. Grants Pass entertains Albany and Klamath Falls is at home to North Salem. Ashland and Crater draw a rest.

Rogue River Battles At Phoenix Tonight

ROGUE RIVER — We'll be there and try to give them a good ball game."

"With those words Coach Wayne Misener indicated the task of his Rogue River High school football team.

The Chieftains go up against the powerful Phoenix Pirates, the No. 1 A 2 contingent in the state. It will be a Rogue league ruckus and will be played at Phoenix.

"It's a tough situation," declared Misener, "to prepare for a ball team this tough. All we can do is hope that luck is on our side." He indicated, however, that the Chiefs have no awe of the Buccaneers.

"We won't have any surprises or gimmicks," reported the Chieftain coach. He said that drill this week has been divided

about equally between offense and defense.

Misener described his tackle situation as "bad." Dave Strickland has been lost by transfer to Eugene and Byron Coulter has been ill. Tackle starters may be Pat McCartney and Wayne Cook or Coulter.

At ends Gus Schefstrom and Dan Bellamy may start. But Bill Koehm, who has been looking good and will play a lot, could get a starting nod. At guards the opening duo is to be Bob Pentecost and Chuck Fuller or Dave Guest. Bob Clark is ticketed for center.

In the backfield the probabilities are Jim LeRoy, quarterback, Alan Gates and Jerry Wahl, halfbacks, and Larry Craig, fullback.

Phoenix is 3-0 this season and Rogue River 2-1. Each won its Rogue opener last week.
