Sea Laboratory Launches Polaris

CAPE CANAVERAL (UPI) — The Navy early today successfully fired a highly advanced Polaris A3 missile more than 1,500 miles from a sea-going laboratory ship.

The 31-foot rocket roared from a launching tube in the deck of the U.S.S. Observation Island at 12:18 a.m. About 20 minutes later, its instrument-loaded nose cone slammed into a target area down-range in the Atlantic Ocean.

The success was a key step in a Navy plan to launch the first of the Polaris A3 models from a submerged nuclear submarine within the next few weeks.
