There are approximately 2,019 students attending Medford High this year. The figure is an all-time record high for the school. The approximate enrollment last year was 1,860.

Because of the increase in students at Medford High, there are also several new teachers. The following people have been added to the faculty this year: Mary Christensen, Sandra Gable, Alyda Gilkey, Robert Gross, and Jerry Sanders, English; Beverly Butts, Sandra Chamberlain, and Joan Kirk, homemaking; Linda Evans, John Finkbeiner, and Mary Gayle Walter, business education.

Also new this year are Helen Roper and Robert Werner, mathematics; Robert Bork, Gary Lovre, and Virginia Westfield, music; Judy Benson, girls' P. E.; Milford Biddington, social studies; Dorothy Corbit, French; and Frank Williams, librarian. Alice Smock and Robert Myrick are counselors.

In addition to the new teachers, there are seven associate teachers and four teachers aides receiving experience in teaching at Medford High.

The homeroom, a 25-minute period required of all students is in use at MHS for the first time this year. This time is set aside for explanation of school rules, movies dealing with teenage problems, and guidance and counseling.

Sophomore class elections were held recently. Those elected are Barbara Halby, president; Sal Esquivel, vice president; Diane Shinn, secretary; and Linda Dorrell, class representative.

Individual pictures for "Crater," the yearbook, were taken two weeks ago. Riley Winchell, Crater adviser, reported that about 630 sophomores and 640 juniors were photographed. Coupons are now on sale for the senior pictures. Large group pictures will be taken later in the year because all the students of MHS are available during third and sixth period only and each picture takes about 20 minutes to take.

"Inherit the Wind," a Thespian production is to be presented Nov. 21, 22, and 23, in the Medford High school auditorium at 8 p. m. by Thespian Troupe 358.
