Bill Miller Lineman Of Week

PORTLAND (UPI) — Rich Barton of Eastern Oregon gained an unusual distinction in the Oregon Collegiate Conference today.
The Mountaineer halfback was named "Back of the Week" in the conference even though his team lost 48-18 to Southern Oregon Saturday. Barton carried the ball 19 times for 127 yards and a 6.7 average.

"Lineman of the Week" honors went to Southern Oregon's Bill Miller, who played on the winning side in that same contest.
League statistics released today showed Frank Ellis of Oregon College of Education the leading rusher with 327 yards in 86 carries. Bill Bailey of Southern Oregon maintained his passing lead with 42 completions in 74 attempts for 477 yards.
End Jim Hollingsworth of Portland State led pass receivers with 15 catches for 298 yards. Sonny Luke and Vic Ventura of Oregon Tech also have caught 15 each, but for less yardage. Southern Oregon's Doug Olsen is the leading scorer with 31 points on three touchdowns and 13 extra points.

Ford Heir Offers To Purchase Lions

DETROIT (UPI) — Industrialist William Clay Ford, admitting the morale of the Detroit Lions is sagging but insisting the dawning of a better day is near, today said he's confident that his \$5 million offer to buy the club will be accepted.
Ford, 38, the youngest of the three brothers who inherited the vast Ford Motor Co. empire and Lion president since 1961, said, "I can't be certain the offer will be accepted but I don't see any roadblocks."
Ford, a devoted pro football fan, said the club has a bright future despite a disappointing 2-3 record this season and reports of dissension among the players.

Waivers Asked On Ferguson

PITTSBURGH (UPI) — The Pittsburgh Steelers Tuesday asked waivers on two-time all-America fullback Bob Ferguson, the first Negro player ever to win the Maxwell Award.
The Steelers said Ferguson, Pittsburgh's No. 1 draft pick in 1962, was placed on waivers "with the hope of making a deal."
"We are trying to make a deal with Minnesota," a team spokesman said. "We hope he isn't claimed by another club until we can work something out."

Ferguson, a 5-11, 220-pound fullback who was the enigma of many an opposing team while playing for Ohio State University, had been out with injuries on three different occasions last year and saw little action with the Steelers.

Ferguson Claimed by Minnesota

The Minnesota Vikings are giving Bob Ferguson a second chance.
Ferguson, a former All-American and winner of the Maxwell Trophy at Ohio State two years ago, was placed on waivers by the Pittsburgh Steelers Tuesday and claimed by the Minnesota Vikings.
Since coming to the Steelers as their top draft choice in 1962, Ferguson had been ineffective. He also was publicly berated by teammates and Coach Buddy Parker during his first season for his sub-par play.

Sezurek Signed

The Cleveland Browns announced that linebacker Mike Lucic has been placed on the injured reserve list and Stan Sezurek has been signed to replace him. Lucic received torn knee ligaments against New York last Sunday and will be out for a month.
Sezurek, who formerly played at Purdue, comes to the Browns from the Cleveland Bulldogs of the United Football League.
Coach Alie Sherman of the New York Giants received some bad news when he learned that flanker Frank Gifford, defensive tackle Dick Modzelewski and punter Don Chandler received assorted injuries in last Sunday's game against Cleveland. Gifford, who sprained his back, is a doubtful starter against Dallas Sunday. The others may play.

Breeding Sold by LA To Spokane

The joyride is over for Mary Breeding, who'll have to start the long tortuous trail back to the big leagues again next spring.
It was fun and profit while it lasted — a half season with the Los Angeles Dodgers, which earned him a slice of the World Series melon.

But the necessity of complying with baseball's 40-player roster rule brought it to an end Tuesday night when the Dodgers announced the utility infielder had been sold to their Spokane affiliate in the Pacific Coast League.

Breeding played in 36 games for the Dodgers but made only one hit in six official appearances at the plate. Pitchers Charlie Spell, Jack Smith and Doug Peters also were sold to Spokane and pitcher Bill Larkin was sold to the Dodgers' Albuquerque team in the Texas League.

Acquired by the Dodgers in the internal maneuvering were infielder Johnny Werhas and pitcher Bob Radovich from Spokane, pitcher Paul Speckenbach, infielder Wes Parker and outfielder Bill Parlier from Santa Barbara of the California League and catcher Jeff Torborg from Albuquerque.

In other player moves:
The Houston Colts recalled catcher John Hoffman from the Modesto club of the California League and bought catcher John Griffin conditionally from the Lynchburg South Atlantic League club.

The Los Angeles Angels unconditionally released veteran catcher Hank Foiles, sent pitcher Pat Rogan to their Hawaii farm club in exchange for pitchers Ed Thomas and George Sherrod and sold pitcher Mike Crubia to their Nashville farm club.

The Milwaukee Braves sold utility infielder Amado Samuel to the New York Mets, traded outfielder Don Dillard to Toronto of the International League for rookie shortstop Wesley Bales and sent utility player Lou Klimchick to Denver for pitchers Dick Smith and Dick Kelley.

The Washington Senators purchased first-baseman Tom Dehart, pitcher George Angel and third-baseman Frank Garnett from farm clubs and assigned pitchers Pete Burnside, Ron Moeller, Ed Hobaugh and Carl Middleford, catcher Cal Needman, first-baseman Larry Osborne, shortstop Ron Stillwell and outfielder Barry Shettrone to Toronto.
