

Hatfield Blasts Political Image

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — Oregon Gov. Mark Hatfield said public image of politicians and politicians was "inefficient, dirty (and) graft ridden," but that government was generally better than sometimes apathetic citizens deserved.

In a talk before students at Occidental College, Hatfield said government would be better if the public gave more attention to it and constructive support.

"We are all married to the politicians," said Hatfield, "and our governmental inlaws will live with us all the days of our lives."

Hatfield said his mail and polls taken over the nation reflected a "cynical catalogue of criticism (that) includes a list of adjectives that is far from flattering."

He said students had a responsibility for a renewed interest with government and should participate.

"Where will we find the talent that government and politics need, if not here?" he asked.

Runaway Juveniles Taken Into Custody

Four runaway juveniles, two from Oregon and two from Los Angeles, Calif., were taken into custody by Medford police yesterday.

The Los Angeles youngsters, a boy aged 13 and a girl aged 14, were reported to be in Medford by the North Hollywood juvenile department.

The boy was arrested about 11 p.m. Wednesday near the residence of a relative, and the girl was taken into custody at a downtown hotel about 4:30 o'clock this morning. They were lodged in juvenile detention home.

A 14-year-old girl from Roseburg and a 15-year-old girl from Winston called police about 11:20 p.m. yesterday to give themselves up.

They told officers they had run away from their home on Wednesday morning after they were expelled from school for smoking. They were placed in the custody of the Medford aunt of one of the girls.

United Parcel Authorized for Oregon Service

SALEM (UPI) — United Parcel Service today was authorized by the public utility commissioner to establish limited delivery service in Oregon beginning Nov. 1.

The decision climaxed one of the most controversial cases ever decided by the PUC in Oregon.

Commissioner Jonel C. Hill said United Parcel Service (UPS) was authorized to offer overnight small package pickup and delivery service to points within a six-mile-wide belt along the interstate highway between Portland and Medford.

Hill said the firm also would be able to serve a six-mile-wide

belt between Portland and Beaverton along State Highway 8.

Medford Terminal Hill listed Beaverton, Eugene, Roseburg and Medford as the cities where UPS will be authorized to give local cartage service. The company has announced these cities will be terminal points.

Hill placed the following restrictions:

No service between retail stores and their customers, shipments not to exceed 100 pounds per day per customer, no same-day delivery and no individual package to weigh more than 50 pounds or be more than 108 in-

ches in length and width.

When the company applied for a permit two years ago, it asked permission to serve the entire state, and to provide direct store-to-customer delivery service.

The application triggered protests from more than 40 firms engaged in package and freight service and led to 32 days of hearings during which 125 witnesses testified.

Udall Announces Program To Help Fishing Industry

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Interior Secretary Stewart Udall today announced a 10-year government program to help the nation's lagging fishing industry compete in world markets.

Named "Trident" after the three-pronged spear carried by the legendary Neptune, the plan calls for scientific research and financial help for U.S. fishermen, now being outdone at the oceans' fishing holes.

Udall said fish in east and west coastal fishing areas, once the sole hunting grounds of American fishermen, are now being caught by hundreds of Russian and Japanese vessels.

Critical Problems In presenting the Trident plan to President Kennedy and Congress, Udall said U.S. commercial fisheries "are facing critical problems at home and serious competition abroad."

The new plan calls for:

— Greater emphasis on research into fishing industry problems.

— Solving some of the industry's financial problems, including support of legislation to lessen the cost of new fishing vessel construction.

— Program to offset subsidies paid by some foreign governments to their fishing industries.

— Increased efforts to expand foreign markets, plus promotional campaigns for home consumption of U.S. fish products.
