United Nations Building Has Meditation Room

With the opening of the United Nations General Assembly in New York City persons are reminded that in the large UN building there is a Meditation Room open to the public.

The room was reopened Nov. 11, 1957, after it was remodeled under the approval and personal supervision of the late Secretary-General Dag Hammarskjold. The project is supported by the Friends of the Meditation Room of the Laymen's Movement.

The room is a V-shaped area decorated in off-white with a projecting panel at the narrow end set apart by a fresco by the artist, Bo Beskow. The fresco's theme is "Infinity."

The chief point of interest is a six-ton slab of crystalline iron ore, an altar stone, a gift of the Swedish government. While the room is in semi-darkness, a tiny shaft of light reflects off the altar stone. This simple study offers a symbol of man's hope for "light of understanding" to flood the "world of misunderstanding."

In a brochure about the Meditation Room, it states: "Prayer is the single most powerful force in the world... Prayer is a dynamic manifestation of love by the concerned, reaching out for God's help for man. You can help change the world by your prayerful action."
