GREENSBURG, Pa. (UPI)—Mrs. Joseph P. Kennedy, mother of President Kennedy, was presented the Elizabeth Seton Medal Saturday at ceremonies at Seton Hill College.

An estimated 1,500 persons attended the ceremonies honoring Mrs. Kennedy for her extensive service to philanthropic and charitable enterprises.

Mrs. Kennedy, the first recipient of the award established in honor of Blessed Elizabeth Ann Seton, first native-born American ever to be raised to the honors of the altar, received the medal from Monsignor William G. Ryan, president of the college.
