



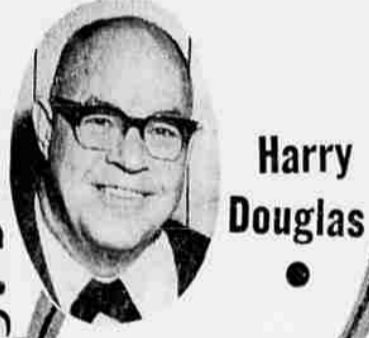

BLM Foresters From 12 States to Meet In Coos Bay Nov. 5

COOS BAY — Bureau of Land Management foresters from 12 states and Washington, D. C., will meet in Coos Bay Nov. 5 for a 10-day conference, Russell E. Getty, BLM state director for Oregon and Washington, has announced.

The conference will promote the exchange of knowledge among professional foresters and lead to adoption of new forestry techniques and further improvements in the management of BLM-administered forest lands, he said.

Discussions will cover such subjects as further applications of automatic data processing, refinements in sampling methods, consideration of more precise tree and log measurement standards, application of the stand structure approach for predicting future timber yields, and establishment of orchards to produce genetically superior tree seed.

Administrators Public Land An agency of the U. S. Department of the Interior, the Bureau of Land Management administers 466 million acres of public land. Of that total, 46 million acres are classed as commercial timberland and 111 million acres as woodland. The Bureau harvests more than a billion board feet of timber annually, over 90 per cent of which is from BLM-administered lands in western Oregon, Getty noted.

Headlining the conference sessions will be panel discussions on forest inventories, management plans, location of roads, appraisals, timber sales, and reforestation.

Also to be considered are the effects of land pattern and tenure forest management. Other topics will be manpower requirements and budgeting.

Reports are to be presented on cooperative research projects jointly sponsored by BLM and other agencies such as Oregon State University and the Forest and Range Experiment Stations. Current projects include re-
