**66 Per Cent of People in County Born After WW I**

How young is the population of Jackson County, measured in terms of its contact with the major events of the last few decades?

How many of the local people were around during the first World War? During the prohibition period? When the stock market crashed in 1929? When World War II started?

Figures released by the government reveal that no less than 66 per cent of Jackson County's population was born after 1918, when World War I ended.

**Prohibition Period**  
In 1920, prohibition went into effect, women got the right to vote in the United States and the League of Nations began. About 33 per cent of the local population was on hand at that time.

The year 1927 was marked by Charles A. Lindbergh's solo flight across the Atlantic and by the appearance of the first talking movie, The Jazz Singer. Only 46 per cent of the present population of the county had been born then.

The advent of the atomic age, in 1942, marked by the first nuclear chain reaction, can be remembered by no more than 61 per cent locally, it is shown.

**A Young Generation**  
All the figures point to the fact that this is a comparatively young generation.

Principally, the preponderance of young people is attributed to the very sharp increase in birth rates following World War II.

The largest five-year segment of the population in the United States consists of those below age 5. There are about 21 million in that age bracket. The second largest group is from age 5 through 9. They total 20 million.

**Are Somewhat Older**  
Taken as a whole, residents of Jackson County are found to be somewhat older than their compatriots in other parts of the United States.

The median age of local people is given as 31.5 years which means that there are as many below that age as there are above it.

In the rest of the United States the median age is 29.5 and, in the State of Oregon, 30.8.

The influx of younger people into positions of importance is typified by the fact that the President is a man who was only 10 years old when Lindbergh made his historic flight and who was 17 when Hitler became Fuehrer, in 1934.

**Vice President to Launch Hard Sell**

AMSTERDAM (UPI) — Vice President Lyndon B. Johnson will launch a million dollar hard sell agricultural offensive aimed at Europe when he opens the "United States food and agriculture exhibition" here Nov. 7.

A task force of government specialists, backstopped by various other specialists cooperating with the U.S. Agriculture Department for this occasion, is preparing the big exhibition. The task force will be strong when Johnson performs the opening ceremonies, but some 30 Americans already are here.

The exhibition is aimed not only at Dutchmen but at the whole of Europe, which absorbs American agricultural products to the tune of \$2 billion annually. European agricultural and trade leaders have been invited to join in the special agricultural symposium that is another feature of the million dollar show.

**Court Quashes Sabotage Charges**

PRETORIA, South Africa (UPI)—Court President Q. De Wet today quashed the indictment against 11 men accused as saboteurs in a case condemned by the United Nations.

Trial of the 11 had opened Tuesday. Four whites, six Africans and one Indian were accused under South Africa's sabotage act which provides for the death penalty in certain cases.

They were accused of preparing a rebellion which was to have included guerrilla warfare and armed invasion to overthrow the government of Premier Hendrik Verwoerd.

Earlier this month the United Nations had urged South Africa call off the trial and free the prisoners. It was apparent from speeches supporting the U.N. action that most delegates regarded the 11 defendants as political prisoners and not saboteurs.
