

Beavers Outlast Stanford By 10-7

CORVALLIS (UPI) — Senior specialist Steve Clark's first period field goal stood up for a 10-7 Oregon State football victory over fumbling Stanford Saturday.

Clark's 21-yard kick opened the scoring and proved decisive as Stanford was unable to hold onto the ball in the second half.

A 66-yard punt return by sophomore halfback Craig Ritchey accounted for the Indians' touchdown. It came on the last play of the opening period and put his team ahead 7-0.

But the Beavers came back to forge ahead to stay on Quarterback Gordon Queen's 2-yard second period touchdown pass to End Len Frketic.

The pass climaxed a 64-yard Oregon State drive that was helped along when Stanford was penalized 15 yards for tripping End Vern Burke.

The Beavers almost had another touchdown near the end of the first half. Queen fired a pass to Halfback Leroy Whittle, who went out of bounds on the 1-yard line with four seconds left. But the Indians' line held on the next play.

Stanford, held to only three first downs in the first half, began moving the ball on the ground in the third period. But fumbles killed the Indians.

Stanford fumbled three times in Oregon State territory in the third period and the Beavers recovered all of them. Two of them were gobbled up by Halfback Danny Sieg, a one-time Medford high school teammate of the Indians' Dick Ragsdale.

Center Dick Ruhl also intercepted a Stanford pass in the third period. The Indians' Braden Beck tried a 42-yard field goal early in the fourth period but it was partially blocked.

It was Oregon State's fifth

San Jose State Stuns Ducks, 13-7

EUGENE (UPI) — Three touchdowns underdog San Jose State scored twice in the first period and made it hold up for a stunning 13-7 football victory over Oregon Saturday.

The Spartans scored in the opening period on a 91-yard punt return by halfback Jerry Colletto and on a 75-yard pass interception runback by halfback Dennis Parker. Parker intercepted a pass thrown by quarterback Jack Sovereign.

It was San Jose State's first win in an eight-game rivalry with the Ducks.

Oregon collected its touchdown in the third period on a

3-yard run by halfback Dennis Keller. The home team marched 86 yards in eight plays for its score.

San Jose State, which upset Washington State earlier this season, recorded its third win in seven decisions.

Oregon, still feeling the effects of a bruising 26-19 loss to Washington last weekend, dropped its third decision against four wins.

The Ducks played without All-American halfback Mel Renfro. Their regular quarterback, Bob Berry, played in only two series of downs in the fourth period. Both were hurt in the Washington game.

Larry Hill, Oregon's other starting halfback, was lost with a shoulder separation in the first period.

Oregon dominated the statistics. The Ducks held a 16-8 edge in first downs and a 244-164 margin in total yardage.

They rolled up 228 yards on the ground and 16 by passing. The Spartans had 86 by rushing and 78 by passing.

In the first half, Oregon ran up 12 first downs while San Jose State failed to make any. The Ducks gained 149 yards to 10 in the opening half.

Individually, Lu Bain, who alternated at quarterback and fullback for Oregon, gained 82 yards in 14 carries. Halfback H. D. Murphy picked up 63 yards in 14 runs and Keller made 63 in 18 carries.

Halfback Kass Jackson gained 37 yards in seven carries for San Jose State.

Both teams have been using liniment and bandages on a wholesale scale but many of the casualties will suit up and play. Minnesota appears to be hardest hit with injuries. Offensive end Ray Poage is in the hospital and halfback Tommy Mason is out with a bad leg.

End Leon Clarke, a former Ram, has been sidelined for the season.

The Rams have a variety of minor ills. Lamar Lundy has a bad shoulder; Rosey Grier and Charley Britt have jammed fingers; Jon Arnett has a twisted knee; and Dick Bass has a heel bruise.

Boyd Bute is the owner of the Stars and "magicians" is what he calls his players. He also maintains the policies of "the world is our audience" and "send them home laughing."

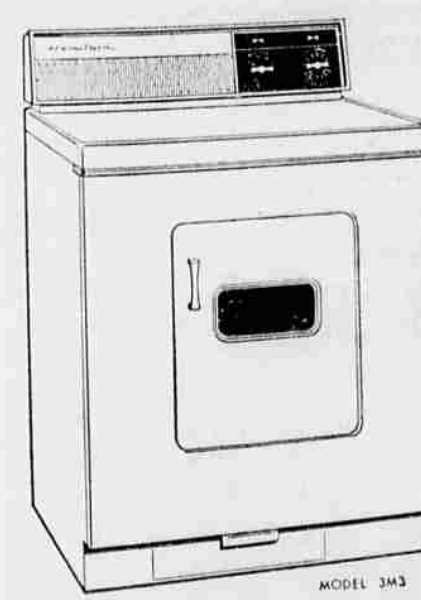
On the team are such players as "Loud Mouth" Billingsley, "Big Daddy" Batiste, "Henry" Brit Johnson and Lindsey Petties.
