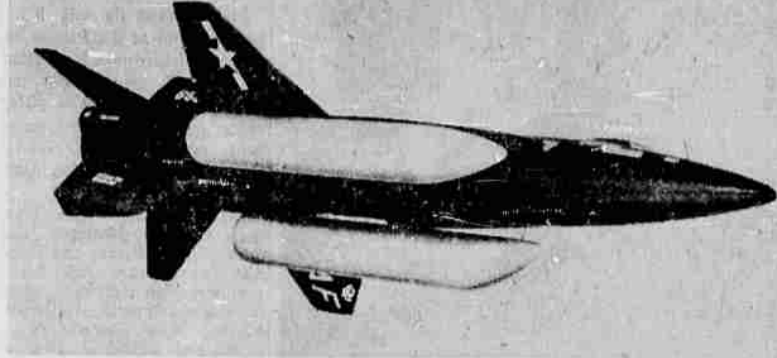
The mules, which pulled a wagon to Oregon from Missouri in 1959 in observance of the Oregon Centennial, were being transported in a trailer.

Cox, Becken Attend Yachts Workshop

Beri Cox, principal of McLoughlin High School, and Dr. Elliot Becken, assistant superintendent of Medford School District 549C, were among 30 school administrators, college professors, and State Department consultants who attended a workshop in Yachats recently to study the merits of flexible scheduling and recommend procedures for assisting Oregon high schools to introduce flexibility into their programs.

Forest Supervisor C. E. Brown reported the Forest Service appraised price for the timber was \$4,080.50. The sale was subsequently purchased by Medford Timber Company at the appraised price.

The timber in this unit consisted of 60,000 board feet of Douglas-fir, 35,000 board feet of western white pine, 35,000 board feet of Shasta red fir, and 145,000 board feet of hemlock and other species.
