Study Reveals Seventeen Per Cent of Babies Have Defects

NEW YORK (UPI) — If you take Kauai, Hawaii, to be representative of American communities, then 17 per cent of American babies enter this world with visible or detectable defects or deficits.

Pennsylvania Bonus Deadline Dec. 31

The deadline for applying for the Pennsylvania Korean veteran's bonus is Dec. 31. To qualify, the veteran must have been a resident of Pennsylvania at the time he entered active duty, and he must have served at least 60 days between June 25, 1950, and July 27, 1953. If he meets the 60-day requirement, he will receive compensation for all his service up to Jan. 27, 1954.

The bonus is paid at the rate of \$10 for each month of service during the Korean Conflict, plus an additional \$5 for each month of foreign service for those who received the Korean Service Medal. Maximum payment is \$500. The maximum is paid to the eligible beneficiary of the veteran who died on active duty during the Korean Conflict.

An amendment to the original bonus act allows career service men with four or more years of continuous service immediately prior to June 25, 1950, who were legal residents of Pennsylvania on Jan. 1, 1951, but who did not receive the Korean Medal, also to collect the bonus. However, the career serviceman may not collect a total of more than \$500 for World War II and Korean service combined.

Application forms are available in Oregon from the Department of Veterans' Affairs, or they may be obtained direct from the Korean Conflict Veterans Compensation Bureau, Room 207, South Office Building, Harrisburg, Penn.

made a long-range study of all Kauai pregnancies and their results for a given period. No other scientific study of its kind had been so thorough.

It gave powerful support to social and other scientists who try to rouse a greater public interest in the prevention of congenital and birth injuries. Here, these scientists contend, are great opportunities for human salvage and social betterment.

Almost half of the 17 per cent required no other care than that ordinarily given by a physician. Most of the remainder had defects or deficits which responded to short-term but special medical and nursing attention.

Need Extensive Care
The remainder was about 4 per cent of the total, and they required combinations of diagnostic services, long-term, skilled treatment, special therapy, special education and custodial care," the scientists said in their report to an organ of the U. S. Public Health Service.

Even with the best of care, three-fourths of these children will be permanently handicapped to some degree. More than half of these who survive to school age will need some form of special education because of physical or mental handicaps. More than one in five will eventually require some form of custodial or institutional care for the duration of their lives.

The scientists were Drs. Jesse M. Bierman, Earl Siegel and Fern E. French of the University of California, Berkeley Campus, and Dr. Angle Connor of the Hawaii Department of Health. Kauai was a good place

for a community study because it is an island at the northwest end of the Hawaiian chain, and outside influences are few.

But in death rate, birth rate, infant mortality rate, and life expectancy it is comparable to continental American communities. In housing, family income, nutrition, educational status, and the availability and quality of medical care it is on the top level of American communities.

Born In Hospital
All babies are born in hospitals and almost all if not all mothers get medical attention during pregnancy.

As part of the study, the babies were checked regularly after they were born and given a thorough examination, psychological as well as physical, at the age of two.

"It is likely that there are children in whom no defects or deficits were noted during this period but who will manifest them as they grow older," the scientists said.

They plan to check over a group of the apparently normal children when they reach school age, in the hope of detecting those who because of birth injury "may join the ranks of the poor readers, slow learners and behavior problems in school."

The hope will be to "throw light on the magnitude of this type of crippling of human capacity and help fill in another gap in our knowledge of the nature and extent of the problem of children who are born physically and mentally handicapped."
