

CORVALLIS — Lyle Kinney and Peter H. Westgard, both of Medford, are participating in the program of the 78th annual meeting of the Oregon Horticultural Society at Oregon State University this week, according to William E. Volmer Jr., Parkdale, president.

Kinney, of Harry and David's, is participating in a panel discussion on harvesting and handling fruit to maintain quality during Thursday's apple and pear section meeting.

Westgard, entomologist at the OSU Southern Oregon Experiment Station, discussed "Trends in Spider Mite Control" during a symposium on orchard disease and insect problems before the apple and pear section.

Other topics for discussion during the apple and pear section meetings include new trends in packaging and processing and a progress report on mechanical harvesting. Westgard, the tree fruit survey and foliar analysis will be subjects for discussion Tuesday during the joint apple and pear-stone fruits section meeting.

Opens Wednesday  
The meeting of the state's oldest agricultural organization opens Wednesday with the first session of the apple and pear section. Sectional meetings for vegetables, stone fruits and small fruits opened today's session.

Dr. John Carew, chairman of the horticulture department at Michigan State University, spoke to the society's general session today. He also discussed mechanical harvesting of vegetables and stone fruits in other talks.

Featured speaker at the annual strawberry luncheon honoring the state's outstanding growers will be Malcolm B. Douglas, Santa Clara, manager of the California Strawberry Advisory Board. Douglas, James E. Jensen, OSU president, will speak at the society's banquet.

Nearly 50 speakers will cover about 20 different topics during the sessions. The meeting is open to anyone interested in Oregon's fruit and vegetable industry. Registration will be at Wilbycombe Hall on the OSU campus.

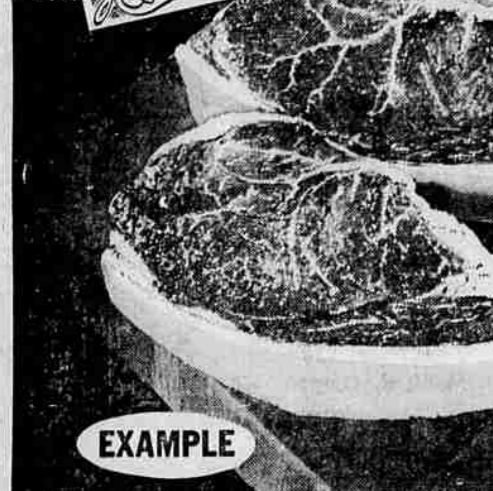

CORVALLIS — The 51 per cent of the land of Oregon that is owned by the federal government has been charted on a first-of-its-kind map by the state by an Oregon State University graduate student in the Department of Natural Resources.

Twenty-one federal agencies own 31,815,902 acres of Oregon's 83,641,600 acre total, the study reveals. County percentages range from 74 per cent in Malheur and Deschutes counties to 1 per cent in Clatsop county.

William B. Carolina made the study under the direction of Dr. Richard M. Highsmith, professor of natural resources and geography.

On the map prepared by Carolina, the location and distribution of federal land in Oregon is pinpointed by agency. It is one of the first studies that brings together data on federal land in Oregon.

The Bureau of Land Management owns the most acres in Oregon, 15,837,354, closely followed by the U. S. Forest Service with 15,001,533 acres. Together, they have about 83 per cent of the federal land in Oregon.

Other federal agencies that have substantial acreages in Oregon include Fish and Wildlife Service, 44,024 acres; Bureau of Reclamation, 172,447; National Park Service, 160,676; Navy, 56,645; Corps of Engineers, 38,472.
