Senator Neuberger Blows Hot, Never Cold, in Book on Tobacco

NEW YORK (UPI) — Sen. Maurine Neuberger, D - Ore., blows hot, never cold, in a new book about tobacco and the public welfare.

She wants a "safer cigarette." She lights out after the tobacco industry and even Uncle Sam, deploring the ostrich posture in America where smoking and health are concerned, as she sees it.

In the book, "Smoke Screen" (Prentice-Hall), Senator Neuberger said there are four general sectors of government activity in which "remedial ac-

tion is presently both justified and tardy." The areas:
—Education of both the pre-smoking adolescent and the adult smoker.
—Expanded research into the technology of safer smoking.
—Reform of cigarette advertising and promotion.
—Cautionary and informative labeling of cigarette packages.

Smoking Division
She recommended the creation within the U.S. Department of Health, Education and Welfare of a separate and distinct division of smoking control.

"This can be done by executive order (by President Kennedy, that is), though it would be

strengthened by a legislative mandate," she said.

The smoking control division, as the senator envisions it, would be charged with the authority to aid states and private associations in the development and dissemination of smoking education materials.

It would be supplied with the funds and authority to conduct a broad range of educational activities on a national scale.

"Such activities should include the use of posters in federal buildings and on federal vehicles, and the purchase of time and space from commercial advertising media for ad-

vertisements calculated to discourage smoking," she said.

Not Dull
The campaign to discourage smoking needn't be dull, as the senator sees it. Or too frightening. It might even take a light turn — if that approach, indeed, helps to convey the health education message.

She cited, as one example, matches designed by scientists at a cancer research center. The message on the covers read:
"Smoke the money — It's healthier."

If that message got across, former smokers of tobacco products would have to smoke \$8 bil-

lion a year. That's how much is spent for tobacco products annually.

But of that amount, \$3.2 billion goes for taxes—city, state and federal. It has been estimated that this year Uncle Sam will reap more than \$2 billion from taxes on tobacco products. The federal tax on a package of cigarettes is eight cents.

In New York City, cigarettes cost around 35 cents a pack. The Tobacco Institute reported that there's a five cent state tax and a four cent city tax, in addition to the federal one, making 17 cents in taxes.

Increase Tax
Senator Neuberger suggests

an appropriate increase in the federal cigarette tax to finance federal research into the causes of cancer, to promote the educational and advertising activities of the smoking control division, and to help develop the safer cigarette she hopes to see.

"Iceland last year modified its tax structure in precisely this manner, adding a one-half cent per cigarette tax, with the proceeds earmarked for the Icelandic Cancer Society . . . which plans to launch a campaign to tell Icelanders of the hazards of smoking," she said.

Through "Smoke Screen," Senator Neuberger hopes to enlist the support of readers in the task of implementing such measures as she suggests.

The Tobacco Institute had "no comment" on Senator Neuberger's book. But it provided this information on the tobacco industry:

—Some 17 million persons derive all or part of their income from activity directly or indirectly connected with tobacco. This includes some three million farm people involved in growing tobacco.

—There is federal control over growing and marketing of tobacco. The agency is the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA).

—The USDA estimates 500 billion cigarettes will be smoked during 1963. Ten years ago, cigarette consumption was 386.8 billion.

—Ten years ago, the per capita consumption of cigarettes was 3,559. This year, the per capita consumption is estimated at 4,005.

Quotas on Beef Imports Stressed

BAKER, Ore. (UPI) — Quotas and import duties on beef imports must be established to halt further depression of the cattle industry in Oregon, Walter Schrock, president of the Oregon Cattlemen's Association, said here Wednesday.

Schrock, of Prineville, key-noted the opening session of the 50th Annual Cattlemen's Association meeting.

Schrock said Oregon recorded the largest number of cattle in the state's history this year according to a cattle inventory.

"These large domestic cattle numbers alone probably would not have depressed our market seriously considering the increase in per capita consumption," he said, however, that imports of beef from Australia and New Zealand have further aggravated the depressed situation in our industry.

"All we ask is a reasonable amount of protection from excessive imports," he said.

The charge went through the front seat upholstery and struck Bishop in the side. He underwent surgery shortly after being admitted to the hospital.

One-Time Mayor Of Bend Dies

BEND (UPI) — Melvin L. Rogers, mayor of Bend in 1958 and the city's outstanding senior citizen in 1955, died Wednesday following a long illness. He was 64.

Rogers was a native of Luverne, Minn.

He was a partner in the operation of Cascade Forest Products, Bend, prior to his illness.

He was a leader in Bend's civic activities and a member of the Bend City Commission for three years. Rogers was a veteran of World War I.

Survivors include his widow, Jean, and a daughter, Mrs. Lorena Hubbs, both of Bend.
