Mrs. B. L. Russell, circle chairman, announced the program.

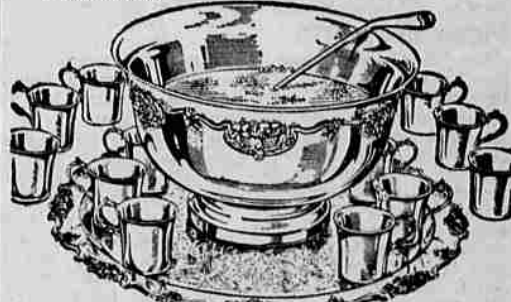
