## Have Idea You Can Win Them All, Al Akins Tells SM Gridders at Banquet

**ANNOUNCES SCHEDULE**  
CLEVELAND (UPI) — The Cleveland Indians will play 43 night home games in 1964, the club disclosed today. A pair of two-night doubleheaders also will be played. The first night game will be against Kansas City April 17.

"Always come up with the idea that you can win them all," Al Akins, Southern Oregon College head football coach, declared here last night.

Akins was main speaker at the annual dinner honoring St. Mary's High School football players and coaches and rally squad members.

Fullback Jeff Randolph and Guard John Lucas were announced as co-recipients of the outstanding player award for the 1963 season. Presentation of the award was made by the Very Rev. Carl Mai, pastor of Sacred Heart Catholic Church parish.

Akins, discussing the "hidden values" found in football, listed as one of the values the search for excellence and said, "I do not accept the philosophy of 'you can't win them all.'" The Red Raider mentor, supporting philosophy that "you can win them all," maintained that players should not be satisfied with mediocre performance, that they should put forth the effort and strive to win and strive for excellence.

### Other Values

Values from football listed by Akins were lasting friendships, building of character; release of energy in a harmless way; sense of responsibility, loyalty and community spirit, or esprit de corps; pride in well-being and physical fitness; learning to compete without quitting; intense competition; ability to face failure, problems and responsibilities and respect for authority through imposed and self-discipline.

"Sometimes you learn more from losing," Akins said. He declared that in football it is not the color of a man's skin that matters but that is performance that counts. He pointed out that not all men can be scientists, that some have to carry the guns and take the

punishment in this country's defense and that athletes make the best soldiers.

"I think there really is a need," Akins said, "to understand the value of athletics." He asked, "Are we getting our money's worth when we spend money for football?" and declared that the hidden values should be searched for.

Winner All the Way The Rev. John Keane, St. Mary's principal, spoke of his, the school's and the parents' desire to "have a winner all the way across the board." He brought out that just playing to be a winner in sports is not enough and that striving to be a winner should carry over into other fields, as well.

Bill Renshaw was chairman of the dinner and presided at it. Bud Parsons was master of ceremonies. Letter awards were presented by Coach Bill McKibbin who also lived the evening by making a number of "golf off" awards.

Father Mai praised McKibbin for developing fine character as well as good players and teams.

### SF Warriors' 'Homecoming' Spoiled 106-102

PHILADELPHIA (UPI)—The San Francisco Warriors had a "homecoming" here Tuesday night but it was spoiled by the Philadelphia 76ers, another transplanted National Basketball Association team.

The Warriors, returning to the city they left two years ago in a franchise shift, were edged 106-102 in an overtime game with the 76ers, formerly the Syracuse Nats. It was the only game scheduled in the NBA Tuesday night.

The game had another nostalgic touch since Alex Hannum, San Francisco coach, is the former mentor of the Syracuse Nats.

Skipworth announced this morning. The game was shifted to Ashland because of the muddy condition of the Phoenix field. Skipworth said. Game time will be 8 p.m.

PHOENIX — Jim Consbruck has paced the Phoenix High football Pirates in both rushing and scoring this fall.

Ron Williams led the passing and Dale Sauer the pass receiving.

Consbruck has rushed for 854 yards on 124 carries and Dennis Williams has 477 total for 106 packs. John Granby has 301 for 57 and Sauer 225 for 33.

Nineteen touchdowns and six extra points have been scored by Consbruck for 120 points. Granby has seven TDs and six extras for 48 points and Williams seven and five for 47.

Williams passing has netted 422 yards on 10 completions in 37 throws. The Pirate quarterback has 600 yards in total offense.

Sauer, Granby and Consbruck each have caught six passes. Respective yards gained were 191, 138 and 91.

The Pirates, unbeaten this season, go into Oregon Class A-2 quarterfinals this Friday.
