**Route 66 Report**  
**Accuses Drivers**  
**In Traffic Toll**

PHOENIX, Ariz. (UPI) —  
Route 66 — perhaps the most  
sung about, talked about, writ-  
ten about U.S. highway —  
stretches 381 miles across Ariz-  
ona taking a bloody toll of  
weary and unwary travelers.

This year — from January  
through September—59 persons  
died in 35 fatal automobile  
crashes on the vacationland  
highway where death takes no  
holiday.

Don't blame the highway.  
There are better roads than  
some sections of Highway 66  
but thousands upon thousands  
travel it without accident.

Blame Drivers  
Frustrated authorities say it's  
tired, sleepy, drinking, reckless,  
irresponsible drivers that bring  
death to themselves and others.

You don't have to look far  
for an example. Go back to  
6:40 a.m. Sept. 11 at sign post  
62.3 about five miles east of  
Kingman, Ariz.

Five persons died there in the  
cool of the new day on a stretch  
of highway where road condi-  
tions and visibility were rated  
"good."

Similar incidents of sudden,  
violent death occur periodically  
at other times and places on  
"bloody" 66.

Eighteen persons have died in  
just four accidents on the well-  
traveled route this year.

There were 29 fatal accidents  
with 53 deaths on the Arizona  
stretch of 66 in 1962, with 19  
deaths in four of the accidents.

Why?  
Three-month Survey  
Authorities have tried to find  
out. They have conducted a  
three-month study, questioning  
170,000 drivers in the survey.

The survey revealed about 20  
per cent of the drivers had  
driven 16 hours since their last  
bed rest. One motorist said he  
had gone 72 hours since the last  
time he had slept in bed. He  
described his journey as a  
"pleasure trip."

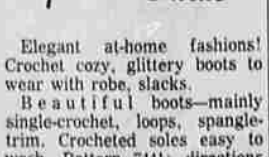
Of the 35 fatal crashes so far  
this year on 66, authorities say  
11 were caused by sleep and  
fatigue, 11 by speeding, five by  
drinking, four by improper pass-  
ing and five by lost control—  
which is to say the driver ran  
off the road.

Law enforcement officers patrol  
the highway. Safety offi-  
cials issue repeated warnings  
but the bloody toll continues  
with authorities wondering who  
will be next to drive too long,  
or too fast, or recklessly or  
while drinking.

What some motorists don't  
seem to know — officers say —  
is that U. S. Highway 66 rises  
from 480 feet above sea level at  
the California border to more  
than 7,000 feet between Wil-  
liams and Flagstaff, Ariz.

Those who have studied the  
problem say that drivers don't  
realize the higher altitude  
makes them sleepy or just how  
much power their car loses at  
higher elevations.
