

# Phoenix, Douglas Clash Tonight In A-2 Quarterfinal at Ashland

PHOENIX—Phoenix High School's power-laden Pirates, with memories of a state Class A-2 co-championship just two seasons back, carry their quest for 1963 Oregon prep football honors into the quarterfinal elimination round tonight.

The Buccaneers will carry on their touchdown and extra point raid against the Douglas Trojans. Their issue will be settled at Ashland on Southern Oregon College's Fuller Field. Kickoff is set for 8 p.m.

Phoenix contends for a fifth consecutive Oregon semifinal berth. Winner of tonight's hassle will surge into next week's round of four against either Vale or Woodburn. Those two schools collide at Vale tomorrow afternoon.

Other Saturday A-2 playoff tilts are Junction City versus Siuslaw at Florence in the afternoon and Willamina against North Catholic at Portland at night.

**Pirates Favored**  
As No. 1 rated A-2 club, Phoenix carries the favored role against the Trojans. Douglas was listed No. 10 in the closing polls. And, Phoenix recorded a decisive victory over Coquille, a team Douglas barely beat.

Also, influencing the prognosticators is the Pirate defensive record. Only one touchdown has been allowed all season by the Bucs. It was yielded to Sacred Heart by the fourth defensive crew.

Declared Coach Jack Woodward of the Pirates, "They've been giving us all the write ups making us the favorite. It kind of puts us on the spot."

Phoenix will face a slot T Trojan offense. Roll out and option runs of Dan Withers and the power charges of Jim Heard are the main threats of the Trojans. Slot back is Pat Patterson and halfbacks are Floyd Meredith and Gary Brown. Potential pass receivers for Coach Les Wolfe's club are Ends Chuck Person and Russ Anderson and alternate Ron Stobbe.

### Gleeson Hired as Yank Coach

NEW YORK (UPI) — The New York Yankees' rivals during the Yogi Berra regime are in for a host of surprises if the new manager's choice of a coach to succeed himself is an indicator of the future.

Yogi caught just about everybody by surprise Wednesday when he selected Jim Gleeson, former outfielder for the Chicago Cubs and Cincinnati Reds, as the Yankees' new first-base coach. At the same time Berra revealed that he is retaining coaches Frank Crosetti, Jim Hegan and Johnny Sain.

Gleeson, 51, was only a journeyman outfielder with the Cubs and Reds between 1936 and 1942, but Berra remembered him from his Coast Guard days and also as a developer of young Yankee talent.

**Played for Jim**  
"I played for Jim at the New London, Conn., submarine base in 1943," said Yogi. "He also handled a lot of our young fellows before he retired from the Yankee organization. Among the present Yankees he managed are Joe Pepitone, Tom Tresh, Phil Linz, Al Downing and Jim Bouton."

Gleeson had a 41-game "look" with the Cleveland Indians in 1936 and batted only .259. He was .223 and .313 respectively with the Cubs in 1939 and 1940 and .233 and .300 with the Reds in 1941 and 1942.

ASHLAND — Southern Oregon College's Red Raiders will host the Oregon district NAIA Cross Country Championship this Saturday.

The four-mile race will be held at the Oak Knoll Golf Course at Ashland, starting at 12:15 p.m.

Defending district NAIA Champ Lewis and Clark will have strong contention from Willamette University, Northwest Conference winner, and SOC, Oregon Collegiate Conference titlist.

The racing dual between Chris Miller of L and C and Norm Oylor of SOC could be the main attraction of the meet. Norm Oylor has raced against Miller once this year and was edged out, so he will be out to defeat the Pioneer barrier.

The winning team of this meet will travel to the NAIA national championship meet at Omaha, Neb.

Linfield and Oregon College will be among entries in the meet.

While the Raider barriers are entertaining, SOC's football team will be in California to meet Santa Clara University tomorrow night. Coach Al Akins of the Raiders has contended that the Broncos will provide the toughest competition that SOC has faced this season.

### West Old Story To LA Lakers

Jerry West is an old story to the Los Angeles Lakers.

The former West Virginia star is enjoying his best season in the National Basketball Association and it's coming at a most opportune time with Elgin Baylor slowed a bit by painful calcium deposits.

For the second straight time Thursday night, West was in the 30's. He had 31, four under his previous night's performance, but it pushed the Lakers past the Baltimore Bullets, 123-115, in a hard-fought game.

West had plenty of help from his backcourt mate, Dick Barnett, who also had 31. Barnett scored 14 of his points in the final period.

**In Trouble**  
Baltimore found itself in trouble when Walt Bellamy came up with his fifth personal foul in the second quarter. He played only half the game and scored 10 points. Terry Dischinger led both clubs with 36 points.

The St. Louis Hawks broke a four-game losing streak by downing the San Francisco Warriors, 117-106, in Thursday night's only other NBA game.

Cliff Hagan scored 38 points and Bob Pettit added 24 for the Hawks, who ripped off 19 consecutive points in the third quarter to take command. Wilt Chamberlain, held to two free throws in the final period, still managed to lead the Warriors with 34 points.
