Ladies of Elks Plan Luncheon

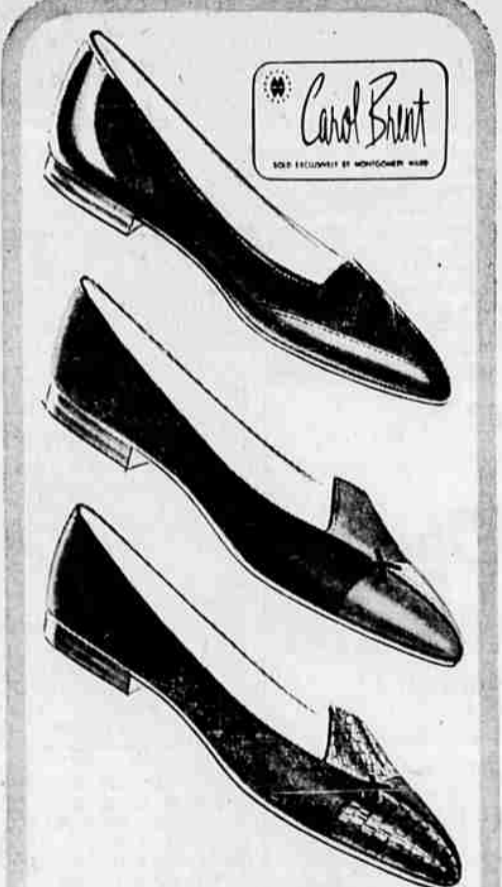
