

African Bloc May Demand Special Session Next Year

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (UPI) — The 32-nation African bloc may demand a special General Assembly session in January to press for economic and political sanctions against South Africa and Portugal, diplomatic sources said today.

The Africans are talking about such a session in the event the Security Council fails to act this month on their demand for firm action to end racial segregation in South Africa and Portuguese colonial rule in Angola.

Security Council action appears doubtful, since the United States and Britain oppose the idea of sanctions and both have veto power in the 11-nation council.

The Africans, with Asian backing and the support of the Communist bloc, could expect a majority in a General Assembly vote on the issue.

The 11-nation General Assembly voted 89-0 Tuesday to begin studies on making Latin America a nuclear-free zone. Cuba, the Soviet Union and most of the Communist bloc abstained. Communist Romania voted in favor of the 10-power Latin American resolution, however.

Cuba said it would agree to the plan only if the United States promised to keep nuclear weapons out of the Panama Canal zone and Puerto Rico, and to give up its Guantanamo Naval Base on Cuba soil.

Some diplomats doubted that the Africans would find support for a special General Assembly session in January because it would raise embarrassing financial questions that many delegates are reluctant to tackle at this time of relative East-West amity.

Trail Man High Bidder on Timber

Arnold Ragsdale, Trail, was high bidder this week for 565,000 board feet of National Forest timber in the Bybee Blowdown area, Union Creek Ranger District, Rogue River National Forest.

Forest Supervisor C. E. Brown reported the high bid totaled \$12,659.25. The Forest Service appraised price was \$12,321.75.

Next high bidder in the oral auction was Wayne Ash Logging, Trail. Other bidder was S&W Logging.

Timber in the unit consisted of 285,000 board feet of Douglas-fir bid at \$29.55, 130,000 board feet of pines bid at \$18.75, and 150,000 board feet of hemlock and other species bid at \$12 per thousand board feet.

S&W Logging, Prospect, was high bidder for 570,000 board feet of National Forest timber in the Whiskey Creek Blowdown area, Union Creek Ranger District. The high bid totaled \$18,902.50. Forest Service appraised price was \$14,100.25.

Next high bidder was Frank Dolenshek of Trail. Other bidders were J. G. Slack and Arnold Ragsdale.

Timber in the unit consisted of 300,000 board feet of Douglas-fir bid at \$38 per thousand, 70,000 board feet of pines bid at \$39 per thousand, 10,000 board feet of Shasta red fir bid at \$11.75 per thousand, and 100,000 board feet of white fir and other species bid at \$12.35 per thousand board feet.

Minimum Wage for Housekeeper Upped

PORTLAND (UPI) — The Conference Board of the Oregon Wage and Hour Commission voted Tuesday to raise the minimum hourly wage for women in "housekeeping" employment from 75 cents to \$1 an hour.

The board increased the pay for minors in "housekeeping" employment from 65 to 85 cents an hour. However, it refused to cut the work week in the same type of employment from 44 hours, or six days, to a maximum of 40 hours.

Walter Lofgren of Portland, president of the Oregon Council of Culinary Workers, Bartenders, Hotel and Motel Service Employees, appeared before the board and asked for a work rate of \$1.25 an hour.

Employer representatives offered 90 cents.

The recommendation of the Conference Board will be subject of a public hearing next Jan. 16.

Cambodia Formally Asks End to Aid
