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Cradle-to-Grave Costs to Appear in Labor Report

WASHINGTON (UPI) — The Labor Department will check prices from the cradle to the grave for its streamlined cost-of-living index that will appear next February.

The costs of funerals—a controversial national topic—will be calculated for the first time in computing average expenses of the city-dwelling wage earner.

Labor Department officials said investigators would check the price of a complete funeral with undertakers in 50 cities. Their findings on funerals will not be listed separately by the government but will be blended with other price data in determining the Consumer Price Index (CPI).

Bank service charges, legal fees, room rent, and hotel and motel charges also will be checked for the first time next January for inclusion in the revised index.

Valuable Statistics The index already includes the cost of a baby delivery, pulling a tooth, beer and whiskey, movie admissions and newspapers in addition to food, housing and transportation.

The index, often considered one of the government's most valuable statistics, will be broadened to include single persons living alone. It formerly was limited to families of two or more.

Ewan Clague, commissioner of labor statistics, said this would make it more useful as an indicator of how the 60 million urban wage earners in the nation spend their incomes. Changes in the price of food,
