The New York Stock Exchange listed companies have about 8 billion shares of common stock outstanding. Telephone at present ranks second to General Motors in the number of shares outstanding. Zoos Want to Use Portland Elephant

PORTLAND (UPI)—At least two zoos in the country want to arrange matrimonial ties between their female elephants and Portland's prolific pachyderm, Thonglaw.

The City Council revealed Thursday that zoos in Boston and Washington, D. C. want Thonglaw to sire new generations of elephants. Thonglaw is the father of four healthy elephant babies at the Portland Zoo.

Ted Reed, director of the National Zoological Park in Washington said the park's budget includes funds for the \$1,500 fee for Thonglaw's services, but not enough for transportation at the present time. Council members reported that plans were under way to enlarge the elephant house at the Portland zoo to accommodate visitors. The Portland Zoo now has five adult pachyderms and four babies.
