

Governor Appoints Committee To Study Aspects of Smoking

The body of a five-year-old girl missing since last March, was found in a hay field near Napa last week by a dairy rancher who told police he had dreamed several times he would find her.

The badly-decomposed body of little Doreen Heskett, of Napa, was found in a field which had been searched by a 3,000-person volunteer force shortly after her disappearance.

Doreen's body was found by Earl Stewart, 65. Police said the body was clad in the same clothing worn by the child when she departed from a playmate and headed for home, four blocks away.

The cause of death was not immediately determined. Told of the discovery, the child's parents said that after eight months "we expected something like this."

Elsewhere, there were these developments:
Judith: Albany police continued their search for clues in the mysterious disappearance of University of California coed Judith Williamson. She had not been seen since leaving her Albany home the morning of Oct. 29 to go to school. The latest theory was that the 18-year-old beauty might have been killed in an unattended underground garage near the campus.

Door: Detectives investigating the past of slain pornography peddler William H. Door discovered a love-nest with "wall to wall beds" maintained by Door in the Lake Malibu area near Hollywood. Door, 48, president of a company that made pornographic records and owner of a night club and other real estate, and the beautiful brunette woman who had been living with him for 18 months, were found shot to death in his home near the Sunset Strip. The woman, Mrs. Ellen Criss, 29, was found nude on a bed.

Masters: Al Masters, veteran University of Stanford athletic director, died of cancer at Stanford-Palo Alto Hospital. Masters, 65, long a foe of awarding "free rides" to potential stars, retired last winter after holding his post since 1925. His death came two days before the annual "Big Game" between the University of California and Stanford.

Cigarettes: Gov. Edmund G. Brown appointed a 10-member blue-ribbon committee to study all aspects of state policy on cigarette smoking and health. The governor said he established the committee "in response to a growing body of medical testimony that cigarette smoking is endangering the health of the people of California."

The committee included Dr. Malcolm H. Merrill, state public health director; Atty. Gen. Stanley Mosk; Dr. Max Rafferty, superintendent of public instruction, and State Finance Director Hale Champion.

The governor cited figures from the State Department of Health indicating the increased risk of lung cancer and coronary disease among cigarette smokers. "If there is anything the state of California can properly do to guard the health of its people . . . from the hazards of cigarette smoking, it should be doing it," he said.

Wenzel: German-born Ruth Wenzel, 37, was declared sane by the same Los Angeles jury which found her guilty of simple assault for taking a shot at her former employer, actor George Montgomery. Miss Wenzel, a housemaid who said she was in love with Montgomery, former husband of Dinah Shore, faces a maximum sentence of 120 days in county jail.

Storm: Clear, calm weather returned to Southern California in the wake of a storm that dumped as much as 3.12 inches of rain along the coast and left a path of mud slides and power failures. The storm dispensed the heaviest rainfall for a single storm this season. It also touched Northern California.

Guidotti: E. J. Guidotti, Sonoma County supervisor for 21 years, retained his post after beating an attempt to recall him. The recall petition charged the 63-year-old Guerneville real estate man with general misconduct, an arrogant manner, use of insulting and abusive language and behavior that was "generally arbitrary and autocratic in vital matters."

Education: A Torrance Board of Education member who offered to build a concession stand at a new high school rather than pay the \$12,000 asked by contractors found he wouldn't have to do the job alone. City fathers said they had been besieged by residents and other board members volunteering to pitch in and finish the building and keep expenses down.

Neighbors Work On Victim's Home
TRUCKEE, Calif. (UPI)—The home that slain Highway Patrolman Glenn W. Carlson had been building near here for his wife and three children is being completed by neighbors.

Some of them had never met Carlson, local officials say. Carlson was shot to death Nov. 15 when he attempted to halt three bank robbery suspects at the foot of Donner Summit on U.S. 40 near here.

"No one had to send out a call for help," Lt. O. P. Ledford said. "The people just appeared."

"They were running into each other, with one person available to drive each nail," he said. The Carlson's home, which overlooks the highway near here, was about 60 per cent completed the day he was shot. Neighbors said it would be finished by Christmas.

Firm's Motion Denied by Judge
THE DALLES (UPI)—Circuit Judge Malcolm Wilkinson has denied a motion by Harvey Aluminum Co. to restrain Wasco County from turning over \$89,132 in tax money to the Chenoweth School District west of here.

The company filed motions Nov. 15 asking that no money be disbursed until the Chenoweth and The Dalles districts settle their boundary dispute.

Harvey contends part of its property is in The Dalles district and part of its taxes should be paid to that district. A circuit court decision on that issue is pending.

Influenza Heads List of Diseases
Twenty-four cases of influenza were reported to the Jackson County Health Department for the week ending Friday, according to Dr. A. Erin Merkel, Jackson County public health officer.

Thirteen such cases were reported from Medford, seven from Ashland and four from Phoenix. Trail reported one case of pneumonia and Medford two. Rogue River reported two cases of strep throat.

Wife of Pioneer Missionary Dies
PENDLETON (UPI)—Mrs. James M. Cornelison, daughter of one of the first Umatilla Indian Reservation agents and wife of a pioneer missionary, died in a hospital Thursday after a long illness. She was 86.

She was the daughter of the late Major and Mrs. Lee Morehouse. Morehouse, in addition to being one of the first Indian agents here, also was known as one of the foremost photographers of the Old West and of Indians in the Cayuse country.

Her widower, Dr. James Cornelison, was the first missionary to Indians in the area after the Whitman Massacre. Mrs. Cornelison was honored in August as "Mrs. Republican" of the Pendleton area by the local Federation of Republican Women's Clubs.

County Declared Disaster Area
WASHINGTON (UPI)—The Small Business Administration has declared King County, Washington, a disaster area as a result of rain and flooding which occurred Tuesday.

The disaster designation permits churches and charitable institutions, owners of homes and businesses, whose property was damaged or destroyed to apply for low-interest SBA loans.

SBA officials in Seattle said the declaration was made in connection with a flood in the Vasa Park housing area near Lake Sammamish. Water backed up because of a plugged culvert and swept across a highway, down a ravine and into the development area where about 20 homes suffered \$100,000 damage.

Concrete Used for Extension Riprap
Broken concrete from the old Federal building at Riverside Avenue and Sixth Street is being used by the city for riprap on the Siskiyou Street extension, according to City Engineer Vernon Thorpe.

City Manager Robert Duff said the city has been using such material for the street's extension during the past two years, obtaining it at substantial saving to the city.
