Winston Churchill To Observe 89th Birthday Saturday

LONDON (UPI) — Sir Winston Churchill celebrates his 89th birthday next Saturday (Nov. 30), the classic case history of a man who reached old age by disregarding the advice of his doctors.

They warned the great statesman many years ago that he was smoking too much, drinking too much, eating too much, working too hard, sleeping too little.

He was prone to serious illness and accident and his family were short-lived anyway. So, the doctors said, he ought to restrict his activities, watch his diet, cut down on alcohol and tobacco and, with luck, he might squeeze out a reasonable life span.

As he enters his 90th year Sir Winston can look back on a health record as remarkable as his political career. Since odds, medical or otherwise, have never daunted him, he played a rugged game of polo till he was 55, drank his friends under the table, smoked constantly, insisted on full-course meals from oysters to dessert and worked around the clock when necessary.

En route to a longevity record for British prime ministers he survived more than 15 major illnesses and accidents. Two or three of which could easily have been fatal and five strokes. The first of these, 15 years ago, paralyzed him but Sir Winston

would not agree it was permanent.

Within a few weeks he was propelling himself in a wheel chair and demanding that his nurse get him a drink.

"The doctor says you are not to have anything strong," she admonished.

"In that case," said Sir Winston, "I'll take a brandy."

He recovered from that stroke although it left him with a weakness of the left leg that makes him somewhat unsteady on his feet.

Muted Celebration

The birthday celebration at his London home this year will be a muted one. Great statesmen are like great actors though the stage they stride is history. They are known to the world by the roles which destiny has assigned them. Sir Winston is the indomitable, unconquerable leader in war, the most honored man of his time in peace.

But behind the public triumphs are often private tragedies and Sir Winston is saddened this year by the suicide of his oldest daughter, Diana, 54; the sudden death of his son-in-law Lord Audley, husband of Sarah Churchill and the health of his beloved wife of 55 years, Lady Clementine.

But nothing private or public has ever been able to crush Sir Winston for very long. And the bulldog jaw will grip his cigar, his fingers rise for the V-sign salute which is his trademark as the crowds gather in front of his house in Hyde Park Gate to wish him still another happy birthday.
