**Gunshots Mark Portland Holdup**

PORTLAND (UPI)—Gunshots punctuated a holdup at a Union Avenue service station early Thursday.

Police said attendant Robert Payne 19, reported a man came into the station and handed him a note saying "This is a stick-up. Don't get excited."

The man, about 30 or 35 years of age, said he had a gun in his pocket. Payne said he handed over \$20 in currency and then was ordered into a restroom. Payne said he managed to get hold of a gun as he was ordered out and when he heard the holdup man approaching the restroom a few minutes later he fired into the restroom door but the bullet did not penetrate.

He said he heard the man fleeing and rushed out of the restroom, firing shots after him. The suspect fired one shot at Payne which struck a window. The holdup man was being sought. It was not believed he was hit.

PORTLAND (UPI)—Oregon's junior senator, Mrs. Maurine Neuberger, said here Wednesday she "presumes" she will be a candidate for reelection in 1966.

The pronouncement was the first inking the woman senator would seek to retain the seat she was elected to following the death of her husband, the late Sen. Richard Neuberger.

A likely candidate for the same seat is Gov. Mark Hatfield, barred by the constitution from running for a third term for the state's highest office. His term is up in 1966.

Hatfield, a Republican, has also been prominently mentioned as a running mate for the GOP presidential nominee in 1964.
