

Deadline Nears for Gifts for Fairview

The Dec. 15 deadline for receiving gifts to be included in the Christmas dinner at Fairview is less than two weeks away. Mrs. Harry Daudt, who serves as critical care coordinator, is gathering remembrances of all ages, regardless of whether the donors are local or from out of town.

There are more than 2,500 residents at Fairview Home in Salem, and the Christmas dinner project stated, "Gifts for distribution to the residents will be gathered and arranged by a special committee."

Individuals and organizations are encouraged to make the Christmas happier for some children who may otherwise be forgotten. Gifts may be left in the care of Mrs. Daudt, 482-0533, in Ashland, or Mrs. R. R. Mearns, 777-1277.

The response had been small prior to Tuesday, Bill Williams, news editor for The Jackson Association of Retarded Children, noted.

Any gifts, remembrances in nature or otherwise, should be left in the committee, he said, as there are persons of all ages to be rewarded. Gifts may also be left unwrapped. If they are wrapped, some indication should be given as to how the gift may be left unwrapped. If they are wrapped, some person would benefit from the gift, Williams said.

Material for the Christmas gifts and dinner is needed by the committee, Williams stated.
