

Hawaii Residents Testify In Land Sale Fraud Trial

PENDLETON (UPI) — Three Hawaii residents testified Wednesday they believed scenic areas shown in advertising material they received were in or very near the Lake Valley subdivision where they bought land.

Seven Chicago and Los Angeles area men are on trial on mail fraud and conspiracy charges here in connection with sale of the land in Oregon's arid Harney County.

Walter Cypriano, Honolulu, said he had never been to Oregon and thought that Ice Lake and Paulina Lake, pictured in the brochures of the Harney County Land Development Corp. were in the vicinity of his land.

Ice Lake is 260 miles away in the Wallowa Mountains and Paulina Lake is 150 miles away.

John Baricastro, a Pearl City service station operator, said he answered an ad in the Honolulu Advertiser and bought five lots for \$25 down. He said he received a brochure with a picture of a man boating on a lake "and took it for granted there were fish in the lake."

He said he also received the impression there was timber on the land, although earlier in the day defense attorney William H. Morrison read from an information letter sent to prospective

buyers which said the tracts were bare of timber.

Cypriano, Baricastro and Ernest Lee, also of Honolulu, said they decided not to go through with their purchases after learning an investigation was under way.

Also on the stand Wednesday was Mrs. Loretta Murphy, Chicago, a sister-in-law of David Frank Koolish, one of the de-

fendants. She said Koolish had asked to use her signature and she signed several documents for him.

"I didn't read what they were," she said.

A parade of other witnesses testified they had asked for their money back after seeing their land for the first time.

John Scharf, manager of the Malheur Wildlife Refuge near the Lake Valley development, identified many of the photos in the advertising brochure as being taken in the Steens Mountains, about 50 miles to the south. Some he could not identify.

He described the Lake Valley area as flat, treeless, and covered mostly with greasewood, a low, bushy plant. He said Harney Lake was alkaline, dry at times, and unable to sustain fish life for very long.

He agreed there was wildlife in the area, mostly antelope, deer, sagehens, and chukar partridges.

The defendants, in addition to Koolish, are his father, Abraham Koolish, Winnetka, Ill.; John Phillips, Evanston, Ill.; Jack Cherbo, Chicago; Richard Dale Walker, Los Angeles; George Isaacs, Glendale, Calif.; and Maurice Hall, Beverly Hills, Calif.

AMMAN, Jordan (UPI) — Prime Minister Shariff Husain Bin Nasir said last night Jordan considers Pope Paul VI's visit to the Holy Land next month as "a great and special honor and blessing."

HITLER YOUTH LEADER HOSPITALIZED

BERLIN (UPI) — Western officials said today that Baldur von Schirach, former Hitler youth leader, will be hospitalized outside Spandau War Crimes Prison for several weeks for treatment of a blood clot in the leg.

The 56-year-old von Schirach was transferred secretly to a British Military Hospital last night from the four-prison prison where he has served 17 years of a 20-year-war-crimes sentence.

CAMBODIA CHARGES VIETNAMESE INVASION

PHNOM PENH, Cambodia (UPI) — The Cambodian news agency charged today that 100 South Vietnamese soldiers invaded 600 feet into Cambodian territory and attacked a provincial guard post.

U.S. ARMY ACCUSED OF PROVOCATION

BERLIN (UPI) — East German Communists today again accused the U.S. Army of "provocations" on the highway to Berlin.

The official East German Communist Party newspaper Neues Deutschland in an editorial said Army convoys were held up at Russian highway checkpoints because the Americans tried to evade customs controls.

NEW YORK (UPI) — Stocks got off to a firm but narrow start today.

MT. EVEREST GUIDE WANTS U. S. VISIT

SEATTLE (UPI) — The guide who accompanied Jim Whittaker when he became the first American to conquer Mt. Everest wants to come to the United States to live.

Nawang Gombu recently notified Tenzing Norgay, the Sherpa guide who accompanied Sir Edmund Hillary in his conquest of the mountain, to let him know his desires to come to the United States. Norgay wrote Whittaker.

Gombu is now working in Darjeeling, India, teaching Indian soldiers at the Himalayan Mountaineering Institute. Norgay is a director at the institute.

Mrs. Whittaker says she and her husband will do all they can to get Gombu and his wife to the United States. Gombu visited in the Whittaker home in Redmond last year on their return from the Everest expedition.

Kennedy Infants Buried by Father

WASHINGTON (UPI) — Mrs. John F. Kennedy returned to a darkened hillside in Arlington National Cemetery Wednesday night to bury the bodies of her two dead children at their father's side.

In a brief and moving ceremony, lighted by the eternal flame at the head of Kennedy's grave, two white caskets were placed beside the slain President.

One contained the body of Patrick Bouvier Kennedy who died last Aug. 9 in the second day of his life. The other contained a sister who was still-born Aug. 23, 1966.

White House Press Secretary Pierre Salinger said Mrs. Kennedy was accompanied by Atty. Gen. Robert F. Kennedy, his brother, Sen. Edward Kennedy, D-Mass., and the former First Lady's sister, Frances Lee Radziwill.

Mrs. Kennedy knelt in prayer at the graveside ceremony conducted by the Most Rev. Philip Hannan, auxiliary bishop of Washington. She remained composed throughout the reinterment.

Intones 148th Psalm

The two small caskets were placed on either side of the

President. Bishop Hannan intoned the words of the 148th Psalm.

The Lord's Prayer was said, and the caskets, sprinkled with holy water, were lowered into the grave which occupies part of a three-acre site set aside for the President.

Under the doctrine of the Roman Catholic Church, children, untaught by sin, go directly to heaven after baptism.

When the ceremony was over the members of the family left the cemetery immediately. The gates were patrolled by an extra guard of military police to keep the service private.

Salinger said the bodies of the two children were accompanied to Washington aboard the Kennedy family plane by Sen. Edward Kennedy.

Patrick Bouvier Kennedy had been buried at the Kennedy family plot in Brookline, Mass. His sister was buried at Newport, R. I.

Plans Kept Secret

The plans for the burial were a closely-guarded secret. The statement on the move came from Salinger, who said he was acting at the request of Mrs. Kennedy.
