Army Nearly Upsets Powerful Middies

PHILADELPHIA (UPI)—Full-back Pat Donnelly ran for three touchdowns Saturday and helped Navy capture its fifth straight victory over Army, 21-15, when the clock ran out with the Cadets just two yards short of a score in a football game dedicated to their slain commander-in-chief, John F. Kennedy.

Directly after the game, Navy announced it had accepted a bid to the Cotton Bowl at Dallas, Tex., on Jan. 1, where it will meet unbeaten, top-ranked Texas.

Donnelly ran four, one and two yards for his touchdowns, tying a Navy record set by Joe Bellino in the 1959 game.

But almost equally tremendous was Army's Rollie Stichweh, who scored 14 of Army's 15 points and recovered a fourth-period "onside" kick which sent the Cadets on a furious assault that finally died when time ran out on Navy's two.

Stichweh dashed 10 yards for a first-period touchdown to put Army in front 7-0 and then, with Navy out in front, 21-7, on Donnelly's three scores and three conversions by Fred Marlin, Stichweh scored on a one-yard run in the fourth period and then ran for a two-point conversion.

With 6:13 to play, Dick Heydt booted a short "onside" kick for his kickoff and Stichweh recovered it on the Navy 49. That set the red-hot Cadets on a final desperate drive, but Navy defenders, led by Captain Tom Lynch, repelled it as time expired and 102,000 throats set up a roar.

Navy's winning touchdown drive, launched in the fourth period, after stopping Army on the Middle nine, went 91 yards, aided by two consecutive foul calls against the Cadets for roughness. The second penalty gave Navy a first down on Army's 28. Two plays later, Donnelly swept around his left end, fought his way past the secondary defenders and ran 20 yards for his third score.

Oregon State Drubs British Columbians

CORVALLIS (UPI) — Sevent-foot Mel Counts scored 19 points and snared 19 rebounds to lead the unbeaten Oregon State Beavers to an 87-47 basketball victory over British Columbia Friday night.

Counts, a senior, sat out part of the first half and was on the bench the final 11 minutes of the second half.

Oregon State, ranked ninth in the nation in the United Press International poll this week, recorded its third victory. It was the Thunderbirds' first loss in five starts.

Jarvis Adds 16

Jim Jarvis and Frank Peters added 16 and 14 points, respectively, for the Beavers.

Dave Way led British Columbia in scoring with 13 points.

The Beavers held the Thunderbirds scoreless in the 9:42 of the opening half to go from a 21-18 lead to a 39-18 advantage at halftime.

Oregon State made 39 of 81 field goal attempts for 48 per cent and British Columbia hit 16 of 56 shots from the floor for 29 per cent. The Beavers held a 62-37 margin in rebounding.

LOS ANGELES (UPI) — Commissioner Ford Frick announced Friday the Pacific Coast League and the International League had completed a swap of working agreements involving Portland, Ore., and Jacksonville, Fla.

The Cleveland Indians, who had been working with Jacksonville of the International League will work with Portland.

The St. Louis Cardinals will take over the Indians' working agreement with Jacksonville.

"This settles the situation satisfactorily," said Frick. "It required a lot of give and take on both parts. Cleveland was very happy with Jacksonville, but it looked like Portland might be left without a working agreement. This agreement clears up everything."

Trull Sets Records In Baylor 20-6 Win

WACO, Tex. (UPI)—Don Trull racked up two new National Collegiate football records today by passing and running Baylor University to a 20-6 Southwest Conference football victory over Southern Methodist.

Trull and his favorite receiver, wingback Lawrence Elkins, set new NCAA records in the most plays executed for Trull and the most passes caught, with 70 receptions, for Elkins.

SALEM (UPI) — Defending champion Lewis and Clark and Linfield clashed for the NAIA Tip-off tournament basketball championship here last night.

Jim Boutin scored 35 points to lead Lewis and Clark to an 87-75 win over Pacific at Forest Grove Friday night, while Wayne Petersen scored 28 to spark Linfield to a 94-82 win over Eastern Oregon at Salem in the semifinals.

Pacific led 47-46 at halftime. Leon Johnson had 31 points for the losers.

Linfield was in front 47-35 at intermission. Eastern Oregon's George Wachter collected 21.

In consolation games Friday night, Portland State defeated Oregon Tech 73-52 at Forest Grove and Willamette topped Oregon College 77-72 at Salem.
