Museum Visitors Exceed Number During Past Year

Jacksonville — Attendance at the Jacksonville Museum for 1963 has already exceeded the full attendance reported for 1962 by more than 5,000, it was noted today in the report for Dec. 1.

Attendance for November was 2,334, which brought the total since Jan. 1 to 60,978. The visitation for the complete year of 1962 was 55,948.

These figures bring the total visitation at the museum since its opening on July 10, 1950, to 574,074.

Guests during the past month were registered from 34 states and the countries of Canada, England, Germany, Kenya, Australia and New Zealand.

A mineral collection, containing rocks found in all the western states, British Columbia and Texas, was presented last month to the museum by Dixon Dysart

during the past week, was given to the museum by Mrs. Florence Dean.

Documents and photographs of historical interest, including a photo of Dr. Jesse Robinson, first owner of the first U. S. Hotel in Jacksonville in 1853, were received by the museum from Mrs. Cora Garrett, Redding, Calif.

A Bible and photographs from the estate of J. W. Merritt, early Jacksonville teacher and Central Point merchant, were presented the museum by B. L. Sanderson.
