Fernandez To Fight Juan Rivero

NEW YORK (UPI)—Middleweight knockout specialists Florentino Fernandez and Juan (Rocky) Rivero are slated for a nationally televised return 10-round fight at Madison Square Garden Friday night as the feature of this week's boxing schedule.

Stocky, wild-hooking Rivero of Argentina won an upset unanimous 10-round decision over seventh-ranking contender Fernandez of Miami Beach and Cuba at the Garden on Nov. 1.

In that slugfest, Rivero was stunned and floundering in the third round but he rallied and gave Florentino a terrific battering in the later going and was credited with a knockdown in the eighth round.

SPOKANE (UPI)—One of Washington State University's all-time great halfbacks, Jerry Williams, may return to his alma mater as head football coach, it was reported Monday.

Washington State University officials refused to confirm today that Williams was being considered for the job to be vacated next month by Jim Sutherland. They said no names of applicants would be announced.

In Philadelphia, Williams answered questions about the report by saying he "would be interested" in returning to the school where he ran up records—some of which still stand—between 1946 and 1948.

Lyle Nance and Steve Wilson had 19 points each for Washington, while Steve Jones paced the Ducks with 26.

Always tough Seattle met St. Mary's at Richmond, Calif., and romped 84-60. John Trevaunt hit 21 points and grabbed 15 rebounds for the Chiefs.

Elsewhere in a light night of cage activity involving Western teams, Gonzaga thumped Whitworth 91-77 as Elmer Deschaine swished 25 for the victors.

Touring University of Pacific was no match for Utah and fell 70-52, but a couple of Tigers had good nights. Bill Wilson and Leo Middleton hooped 28 and 22 respectively.

Idaho State fought the good fight at Omaha, Neb., but lost to Creighton 63-61. Northwest Nazarene College dumped Whitman, 72-65.

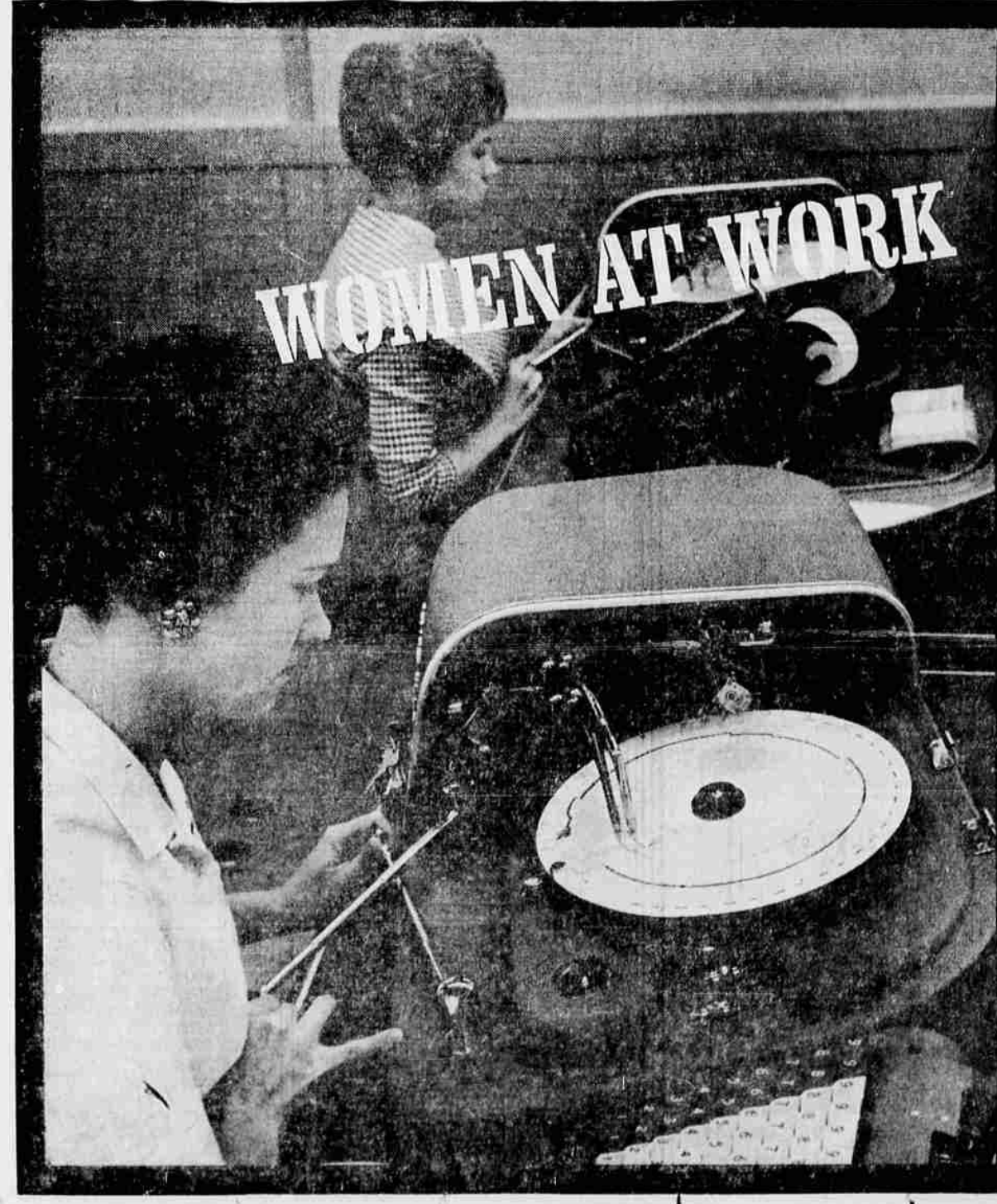
