William and Mary Grid Mentor Quits

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. (UPI) — Milton Drewer at 40 may be looking around for a new career and William and Mary college is looking for a new football coach.

Drewer, who only a year ago was a victim of an alumni power play, quit the Indians after failing to win assurances he would get field support so he could field a winning team. He never had one in seven years as head coach.

But now that he and William and Mary parted, Drewer seems unconcerned about more coaching. "The situation was set up a year ago when a group of alumni tried to have him removed completely. His second three year contract was due to expire then."

Instead, Drewer hung on but yielded the title of athletic director to H. Lester Hooker while retaining the title of head coach.

Gambold Interested In WSU Grid Post

STANFORD, Calif. (UPI) — Bob Gambold, Stanford assistant football coach, said today he "definitely" was interested in the vacant head coaching job at Washington State.

"I've been interested for quite a while in becoming a head coach," said Gambold. "I have had some inquiries about the Washington State job."

"But I haven't had anything official in the way of an offer," Gambold formerly was an assistant coach at Washington State and Oregon State.

Ward Criticizes Chicago Trace

PORTLAND (UPI) — Pete Ward, rookie third base star for the Chicago White Sox last season, Tuesday night criticized the deal which sent veteran second baseman Nellie Fox from the American League baseball team to Houston.

"The White Sox acquired pitcher Jim Golden and outfielder Danny Murphy from the National League team. 'I definitely think it'll hurt us,' Ward said. 'He's too valuable. I don't like to see him go. I just can't see it.'"

Ward said "we had a young infield" last season and that Fox was the infield and team leader.

Player Will Wear Protective Helmet Because of Cuts

SEATTLE (UPI)—Seattle Totem defenseman Larry Zeidel will wear a protective helmet if he goes on the ice tonight when the Totems meet the Portland Buckaroos here.

Zeidel was cut from ear to ear Sunday night in Portland by the stick of Pat Hannigan of the Buckaroos. Keith Allen, Totem Coach, said it was the worst hockey cut he'd ever seen. And he is indignant that no penalty was called against Hannigan for inflicting the injury.

"For Larry to get cut in the head like that," Allen said, "Hannigan had to be carrying his stick pretty high. If Larry had been high-sticking too, he could have warded off the injury."

Early Game Ignored by Oddsmakers

NEW YORK (UPI) — The oddsmakers, ignoring the New York Giants' 31-0 setback by Pittsburgh in their first game this season, are quoting Allie Sherman's men as 7-point favorites for their climatic return game with the Steelers at Yankee Stadium Sunday.

The Giants need a win or a tie against the Steelers to qualify for the National Football League's championship playoff for the third straight year.

The Chicago Bears are picked to defeat the Detroit Lions by at least six points at Chicago Sunday and thus wrap up the Western Division championship.

Packers Picked
The Green Bay Packers are 17-point favorites over the Forty-Niners in a Saturday afternoon game at San Francisco. The Packers can win the Western crown for the fourth year if they beat the Forty-Niners and the Lions upset the Bears.

In Sunday's other NFL games, the Colts are 9 over the Los Angeles Rams at Baltimore; the Eagles are 1 over the Minnesota Vikings at Philadelphia; the St. Louis Cardinals are picked by 9 at home over the Dallas Cowboys, and the Cleveland Browns are favored by 8 over the Redskins at Washington.

In Saturday afternoon's American Football League games, the Boston Patriots are favored by 2 points over the Chiefs at Kansas City and the Buffalo Bills are 5 over the Jets at New York.

On Sunday, the Oakland Raiders are picked by 13 at home over the Denver Broncos, and the San Diego Chargers are 4 over the Oilers at Houston.

Santa Clara Tops Miami

There were plenty of storm warnings hoisted along the Western coast before the Miami Hurricanes came to the San Francisco Bay area, but the Floridians hardly caused a stir when they finally arrived Tuesday night.

Miami had a 99 point-per-game average and an All-America candidate in Rick Barry, who sported a 34-point average. Santa Clara took on this whirlwind Tuesday night and tamed it, 66-77.

Barry did live up to his press notices as he maintained his record by hitting 34 points, but Bruce Asch of the Broncos had 21 and Russ Vrankovich 23 to spark a well-balanced attack.

It was a fine comeback for the Broncos, who looked as if they were in big trouble when they dropped their season opener to lowly San Francisco State.

Steelers In Photo Finish

PITTSBURGH (UPI)—Photo finishes have been the pattern in six of seven victories of the Pittsburgh Steelers this season and the experience is no novelty for club President Art Rooney who breeds Thoroughbreds.

"I'd rather see my horses win in a photo finish than by six lengths," said Rooney relaxing in his office as he reflected on the Steelers' amazing performance this season.

The Steelers play the New York Giants Sunday at Yankee Stadium in what will be the championship game for the Eastern Division of the National Football League. The best previous effort of the Steelers was in 1947 when they reached a playoff for the division title, only to be vanquished 21-0 by the Philadelphia Eagles.
