Former Oregon Man Drowns As Car Goes Off Road

YREKA — Thomas Lindsey Lotz, 40, of Lumgreys Creek, Route 3, Box 25, drowned in the Klamath River Dec. 10 after the car which he was driving missed a curve in the Klamath River Highway and went into the river. According to the California Highway Patrol, Lotz and his son, Andrew H. Lotz, 15, escaped through a window before the car submerged in more than 20 feet of water. The boy attempted to drag his father to the bank, but was unable to hold onto him. The body was recovered the next morning. The accident occurred about 10:30 p.m. eight miles west of U. S. 99. An autopsy established the cause of death.

Nazi War Planes Start Ocean Trip

PRESTWICK, Scotland (UPI)—Four Britons departed for New York Thursday night in two 25-year-old Messerschmitt fighter planes, relics of World War II still marked with Nazi swastikas. The team's leader, John Hawks, a former Royal Air Force flying instructor, said the airplanes will be sold at the end of the 2,700-mile flight — if they make it. One will be purchased by Aero Associates Inc., the other by aviation journalist Martin Caidin.

DUTCH BLAME LUNG CANCER ON SMOKING

 PERLIN (UPI)—American Author John Steinbeck, after his first look at the Berlin wall, said today the Communist sector of this divided city is a concentration camp. He told a news conference in West Berlin that he had planned to visit the Communist zone but changed his mind because the anti-refugee wall made him sick.

Spokesmen for the union said the attrition agreement was negotiated rapidly because of a decision by a federal judge preventing a federal arbitration board from interfering with the U. S. Steel-owned railroad and its 600 BLE-represented employees.
