

Accidents Checked By Medford Police

A series of traffic accidents including three hit and run collisions were reported to Medford police Friday and Saturday.

Roger Hamlin, 17, Corvallis, grew 35 acres of sweet corn for Albany Frozen Foods to win the western regional contest in the special processing section of the production and marketing contest.

Walter Mendenhall, 17, Willamina, a candidate for national honors, produced five acres of pole beans for J.C. Tracy Co., Dallas.

Committee To Seek Federal Funds

SALEM (UPI) — A 16-member committee to seek federal funds for a proposed Portland graduate study and research center and for other college construction in Oregon was named Friday by Gov. Mark Hatfield.

Named to the committee were Dr. Roy Lieuellen, chancellor of the state system of Higher Education; Dr. Leon P. Minear, superintendent of public instruction; Tom Bolger, Portland, and the 13-man board of trustees of the Graduate Study and Research Center.

The committee was authorized by the 1963 legislature.

An education bill signed into law this week by President Johnson makes available to Oregon \$2.1 million in construction money for four-year institutions and about \$570,000 for community colleges. The federal funds must be matched by state money.

The same law also provides federal funds to help establish graduate schools.

Two Appear in District Court

Carl Edward Taylor, 25, Oroville, Calif., pleaded guilty in Jackson County District Court Friday to charges of causing children to become dependent. Imposition of a six months county jail was suspended.

Taylor was placed on probation for five years providing he pay \$50 a month support starting Feb. 1, 1964, and raise this to \$75 monthly starting in June, 1964.

Portland Man Killed In Ft. Lewis Mishap
